





- Disinformation spreads quicker today due to the internet and phones


How Al differs

Faster to use







- "Generative Adversarial Networks" (GAN) do the Work






Legislation on AI in Campaigning - 2024




Al Campaign Enactments





Al prohibition states




Minnesota and Texas

- Prohibit the dissemination (or entering into an agreement to disseminate)
- Prohibited a certain number of days prior to an election

candidate or influence an election

Al disclosure requirement states



California, Michigan and Washington

- Disclosure must be as large as the average size of other text on screen
- Must appear for the duration of the video
- If audio, must be stated at the beginning and end

Other approaches states can consider


Review current statutes

Wisconsin 1973 statute states: No person may knowingly make or publish, or cause to be made or published, a false representation

Require information in metadata




