SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2614 by House Committee on Elections

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2614 is respectfully submitted to your committee.


HB 2614 would require to provide notice of revocation of agency rules and regulations to affected businesses, local governmental units, and members of the public. The bill would continue to have the Attorney General review and approve the revocations. The bill would also remove certain abolished or inactive state agencies from the five-year state agency review requirement. Under current law, listed state agencies that have adopted rules and regulations to submit a report to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations that summarizes the agency's review and evaluation of rules and regulations the agency has adopted.

The Office of the Attorney General states that the changes in the process for revocation of rules and regulation with enactment of HB 2614 would have no fiscal effect, as the agency already is required to review and approve revocations. The bill would require those agencies to provide written notice of such revocation to affected businesses, local governmental units, and to the public. The state agencies would also be required to submit those rules and regulations to the Attorney General. The Secretary of State indicates HB 2614 would not have a fiscal effect on agency operations. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2614 is not reflected in *The FY 2025 Governor's Budget Report*.
