10 AN ACT concerning wildlife and parks; relating to conservation stamps;
11 amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 32-988 and repealing the existing section.

13 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

14 New Section 1. (a) (1) Commencing ~~July 1, 2003~~ **January 1, 2004**,
15 except as otherwise provided by law or rules and regulations of the sec-
16 retary and in addition to any other license, permit or stamp required by
17 law or rules and regulations of the secretary, a valid upland game bird
18 restoration stamp is required to hunt game birds in this state ***except that***
19 ***licenses to hunt in controlled shooting areas shall not be required***
20 ***to have such stamp.***

21 (2) The provisions of this subsection do not apply to hunting, by legal
22 means, by a person not required by K.S.A. 32-919, and amendments
23 thereto, to possess a hunting license.

24 (3) The stamp required by this subsection is valid throughout the
25 state. The stamp required by this subsection is valid from the date of
26 issuance and expires on June 30 following its issuance.

27 (4) Each upland game bird restoration stamp shall be validated by
28 the signature of the stamp holder written across the face of the stamp.

29 (b) The secretary, in accordance with K.S.A. 32-805, and amend-
30 ments thereto, may adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out the
31 provisions of this section.

32 ***(c) The secretary shall make a written report annually, begin-***
33 ***ning on February 1, 2005, to the senate committee on natural re-***
34 ***sources and to the house committee on environment and the house***
35 ***committee on tourism and parks.***

36 New Sec. 2. (a) All moneys received pursuant to the issuance of the
37 upland game bird restoration stamps shall be remitted to the state trea-
38 surer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amend-
39 ments thereto. Upon receipt of such remittance, the state treasurer shall
40 deposit the entire amount into the state treasury to the credit of the
41 upland game bird restoration fee fund ***which is hereby created.*** All
42 expenditures from such fund shall be in accordance with appropriation
43 acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant

1 to vouchers approved by the secretary.

2 (b) Of the moneys credited to the upland game bird restoration fee
3 fund, 50% shall be used to increase public access to private land and 50%
4 shall be used to increase upland game bird habitats on private property.
5 No funds shall be expended from the upland game bird restoration fee
6 fund to purchase private land.

7 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 32-988 is hereby amended to read as fol-
8 lows: 32-988. (a) The secretary is authorized to adopt, in accordance with
9 K.S.A. 32-805 and amendments thereto, rules and regulations fixing the
10 amount of fees for the following items, subject to the following limitations
11 and subject to the requirement that no such rules and regulations shall
12 be adopted as temporary rules and regulations:

13 Big game permits

14 Resident (other than elk permit): maximum \$100

15 Nonresident (other than elk permit): maximum \$400

16 Elk permit: maximum \$350

17 Big game tag: maximum \$10

18 Nonresident applications: maximum \$5

19 Combination hunting and fishing licenses

20 Resident: maximum \$50

21 Lifetime: maximum \$1,000; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$150

22 Nonresident: maximum \$200

23 Commercial dog training permits: maximum \$25

24 Commercial guide permit or associate guide permit

25 Resident: maximum \$250

26 Nonresident: maximum \$1,000

27 Commercial harvest or dealer permits: maximum \$200

28 Commercial prairie rattlesnake harvesting permits

29 Resident or nonresident with valid hunting license: maximum \$5

30 Resident or nonresident nonfirearm without valid hunting license: maximum \$20

31 Controlled shooting area operator license: maximum \$400

32 Duplicate licenses, permits, stamps and other issues of the department: maximum \$10

33 Falconry

34 Permits: maximum \$300

35 Examinations: maximum \$100

36 Field trial permits: maximum \$25

37 Fishing licenses

38 Resident: maximum \$25

39 Lifetime: maximum \$500; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$75

40 Nonresident: maximum \$75

41 Five-day nonresident: maximum \$25

42 Institutional group: maximum \$200

43 Special nonprofit group: maximum \$200

- 1 Twenty-four-hour: maximum \$10
- 2 Fur dealer licenses
- 3 Resident: maximum \$200
- 4 Nonresident: maximum \$400
- 5 Furharvester licenses
- 6 Resident: maximum \$25
- 7 Lifetime: maximum \$500; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$75
- 8 Nonresident: maximum \$400
- 9 Game breeder permits: maximum \$15
- 10 Handicapped hunting and fishing permits: maximum \$5
- 11 Hound trainer-breeder running permits: maximum \$25
- 12 Hunting licenses
- 13 Resident: maximum \$25
- 14 Lifetime: maximum \$500; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$75
- 15 Nonresident 16 or more years of age: maximum \$125
- 16 Nonresident under 16 years of age: maximum \$75
- 17 Controlled shooting area: maximum \$25
- 18 Forty-eight-hour waterfowl permits: maximum \$25
- 19 Migratory waterfowl habitat stamps: maximum \$8
- 20 Mussel fishing licenses
- 21 Resident: maximum \$200
- 22 Nonresident: maximum \$1,500
- 23 Rabbit permits
- 24 Live trapping: maximum \$200
- 25 Shipping: maximum \$400
- 26 Raptor propagation permits: maximum \$100
- 27 Rehabilitation permits: maximum \$50
- 28 Scientific, educational or exhibition permits: maximum \$10
- 29 *Upland game bird restoration stamp: maximum \$10*
- 30 Wildlife damage control permits: maximum \$10
- 31 Wildlife importation permits: maximum \$10
- 32 Special permits under K.S.A. 32-961: maximum \$100
- 33 Miscellaneous fees
- 34 Special events on department land or water: maximum \$200
- 35 Special departmental services, materials or supplies: no maximum
- 36 Other issues of department: no maximum
- 37 Vendor bond: no maximum
- 38 (b) The fee for a landowner-tenant resident big game hunting permit
- 39 shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a general resident big game
- 40 hunting permit.
- 41 (c) The fee for a furharvester license for a resident under 16 years of
- 42 age shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a resident furharvester
- 43 license.

1 (d) The secretary may establish, by rules and regulations adopted in
2 accordance with K.S.A. 32-805 and amendments thereto, different fees
3 for various classes and types of licenses, permits, stamps and other issu-
4 ances of the department which may occur within each item as described
5 under subsection (a).

6 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 32-988 is hereby repealed.

7 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
8 publication in the statute book.
