AN ACT concerning health insurance; establishing a moratorium on new mandated benefits or coverages.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) For a period commencing on the effective date of this act and ending on June 30, 2007, no individual or group health insurance policy, medical service plan, contract, hospital service corporation contract, hospital and medical service corporation contract, fraternal benefit society or health maintenance organization which provides coverage for accident and health services and which is delivered, issued for delivery, amended or renewed on or after July 1, 2005, shall be required to provide for or include any additional mandated benefit or coverage in addition to the benefits or coverages required by law on the effective date of this act.

- (b) No provision of subsection (a) shall be construed to prohibit an employer from providing, additional coverage or benefits in any individual or group health insurance policy, medical service plan, contract, hospital service corporation contract, hospital and medical service corporation contract, fraternal benefit society or health maintenance organization which provides coverage for accident and health services for the employer and such employer's employees during the time period specified in subsection (a).
- (c) No provision of subsection (a) shall be construed to prohibit any individual or group health insurance policy, medical service plan, contract, hospital service corporation contract, hospital and medical service corporation contract, fraternal benefit society or health maintenance organization which provides coverage for accident and health services from expanding, or electing to expand, the coverage and benefits which provides coverage for the employer and such employer's employees.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
