

SENATE BILL No. 26

AN ACT concerning legal holidays; amending K.S.A. 35-107 and repealing the existing section.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. K.S.A. 35-107 is hereby amended to read as follows: 35-107. (a) On and after January 1, ~~1976~~ 2006, the following days are declared to be legal public holidays and are to be observed as such:

- New Year's Day, January 1;
- ~~Lincoln's Birthday, the twelfth day in February;~~
- ~~Washington's Birthday, the third Monday in February;~~
- Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, the third Monday in January;*
- President's Day, the third Monday in February;*
- Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;
- Independence Day, July 4;
- Labor Day, the first Monday in September;
- Columbus Day, the second Monday in October;
- Veterans' Day, the eleventh day in November;
- Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November;
- Christmas Day, December 25.

(b) Any reference in the laws of this state concerning observance of legal holidays shall on and after January 1, ~~1976~~ 2006, be considered as a reference to the day or days prescribed in subsection (a) ~~hereof~~ for the observance of such legal holiday or holidays.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 35-107 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
