13 AN ACT concerning campaign finance; pertaining to certain daily reports
14 of contributions[; ***pertaining to campaign treasurer's reports; re-***
15 ***lating to the use of unexpended campaign funds; reporting***
16 ***requirements for precinct committeemen and precinct commit-***
17 ***teewomen; amending K.S.A. 25-4142, 25-4148 and 25-4157a and***
18 ***K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 25-4143 and repealing the existing sections.***

20 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

21 ***[New]*** Section 1. (a) Every treasurer for a candidate for state or local
22 office shall file reports of campaign contributions as prescribed by this
23 act. Reports filed by treasurers for candidates for state office, other than
24 officers elected on a state-wide basis, shall be filed in ~~both~~ the office of
25 the secretary of state ~~and in the office of the county election officer of~~
26 ~~the county in which the candidate is a resident.~~ Reports filed by treasurers
27 for candidates for state-wide office shall be filed only with the secretary
28 of state. Reports filed by treasurers for candidates for local office shall be
29 filed in the office of the county election officer of the county in which
30 the name of the candidate is on the ballot. Reports required by this sec-
31 tion shall be in addition to any other reports required by law.

32 (b) The report shall contain the name and address of each person
33 who has made one or more contributions in an aggregate amount or value
34 of \$300 or more during the period commencing 11 days before a primary
35 or general election at which a state or local officer is to be elected and
36 ending upon the day ~~of~~ ***before*** such election. The report shall be made
37 on or before the close of the ~~next business~~ ***[second business day fol-***
38 ***lowing the]*** day in which any contribution is received. The report shall
39 contain the amount and date of the contribution, including the name and
40 address of every lender, guarantor and endorser when the contribution
41 is in the form of an advance or loan.

42 (c) Reports required by this section shall be filed via ~~e-mail~~ ***[elec-***
43 ***tronic means]***, facsimile transmission, telegram or express delivery

1 service.

2 (d) **Reports filed with the secretary of state pursuant to this sec-**
3 **tion shall be provided to the public on the ~~secretary of state's~~ [gov-**
4 **ernmental ethics commission's] website and in any other manner**
5 **the secretary of state deems appropriate.**

6 (e) (1) “Local office” shall have the meaning ascribed to it in K.S.A.
7 25-4143 and amendments thereto.

8 (2) “State office” shall have the meaning ascribed to it in K.S.A. 25-
9 4143 and amendments thereto.

13 **[Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-4148 is hereby amended to read as follows:**
14 **25-4148. (a) Every treasurer shall file a report prescribed by this**
15 **section. Reports filed by treasurers for candidates for state office,**
16 **other than officers elected on a state-wide basis, shall be filed in**
17 **both the office of the secretary of state and in the office of the county**
18 **election officer of the county in which the candidate is a resident.**
19 **Reports filed by treasurers for candidates for state-wide office shall**
20 **be filed only with the secretary of state. Reports filed by treasurers**
21 **for candidates for local office shall be filed in the office of the county**
22 **election officer of the county in which the name of the candidate is**
23 **on the ballot. Except as otherwise provided by subsection (h), all**
24 **such reports shall be filed in time to be received in the offices re-**
25 **quired on or before each of the following days:**

26 **[(1) The eighth day preceding the primary election, which re-**
27 **port shall be for the period beginning on January 1 of the election**
28 **year for the office the candidate is seeking and ending 12 days be-**

- 7 *[(3) the aggregate amount of all proceeds from bona fide sales*
8 *of political materials such as, but not limited to, political campaign*
9 *pins, buttons, badges, flags, emblems, hats, banners and literature;*
- 10 *[(4) the aggregate amount of contributions for which the name*
11 *and address of the contributor is not known;*
- 12 *[(5) each contribution, rebate, refund or other receipt not oth-*
13 *erwise listed;*
- 14 *[(6) the total of all receipts;*
- 15 *[(7) the name and address of each person to whom expenditures*
16 *have been made in an aggregate amount or value in excess of \$50,*
17 *with the amount, date, and purpose of each; the names and ad-*
18 *dresses of all persons to whom any loan or advance has been made;*
19 *when an expenditure is made by payment to an advertising agency,*
20 *public relations firm or political consultants for disbursement to*
21 *vendors, the report of such expenditure shall show in detail the*
22 *name of each such vendor and the amount, date and purpose of the*
23 *payments to each;*
- 24 *[(8) the name and address of each person from whom an in-kind*
25 *contribution was received or who has paid for personal services*
26 *provided without charge to or for any candidate, candidate com-*
27 *mittee, party committee or political committee, if the contribution*
28 *is in excess of \$50 and is not otherwise reported under subsection*
29 *(b)(7), and the amount, date and purpose of the contribution;*
- 30 *[(9) the aggregate of all expenditures not otherwise reported*
31 *under this section; and*
- 32 *[(10) the total of expenditures.*
- 33 *[(c) Treasurers of candidates and of candidate committees shall*
34 *be required to itemize, as provided in subsection (b)(2), only the*
35 *purchase of tickets or admissions to testimonial events by a person*
36 *who purchases such tickets or admissions in an aggregate amount*
37 *or value in excess of \$50 per event, or who purchases such a ticket*
38 *or admission at a cost exceeding \$25 per ticket or admission. All*
39 *other purchases of tickets or admissions to testimonial events shall*
40 *be reported in an aggregate amount and shall not be subject to the*
41 *limitations specified in K.S.A. 25-4154, and amendments thereto.*

13 *inct committeeman or committeewoman shall keep, or cause to be*
14 *kept, a detailed account of all moneys received by such person and*

33 *[(c) In addition to the requirements of subsection (b), each per-*

7 *[(e) The terms "contribution," "expenditure," "expressly advo-*
8 *cate the nomination, election or defeat of a clearly identified can-*
9 *didate" and "person" shall have the meaning ascribed to them in*
10 *K.S.A. 25-4143 and amendments thereto.*

11 *[(f) Violation of this section is a class C misdemeanor.*

12 *[(g) The provisions of this section shall be part of and supple-*
13 *mental to the Kansas campaign finance act.]*
