

**HOUSE BILL No. 2869**

9 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending  
10 June 30, 2007, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital  
11 improvement projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and lim-  
12 itations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements  
13 and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 2-  
14 223, 55- 193, 75-2319, 76-775, 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425c, 79-3425i  
15 and 82a-953a and repealing the existing sections.  
16

17 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

18 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2007, appropriations  
19 are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and  
20 transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and  
21 acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as pro-  
22 vided in this act.

23 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate  
24 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized  
25 by this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to  
26 the restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

27 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of  
28 K.S.A. 75-6702 and amendments thereto.

29 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the  
30 provisions of K.S.A. 46- 155 and amendments thereto.

12 (a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general  
13 fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, the following:

14	Operations (including official hospitality).....	\$15,571,358
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15 *Provided*, That any unencumbered balance in the operations (including  
16 official hospitality) account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2006, is hereby  
17 reappropriated for fiscal year 2007: *Provided further*, That expenditures  
18 may be made from this account, pursuant to vouchers approved by the  
19 chairperson or vice-chairperson of the legislative coordinating council, to  
20 pay compensation and travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allow-  
21 ances as authorized by K.S.A. 75-3212 and amendments thereto for mem-  
22 bers and associate members of the advisory committee to the Kansas  
23 commission on interstate cooperation established under K.S.A. 46-407a  
24 and amendments thereto for attendance at meetings of the advisory com-  
25 mittee which are authorized by the legislative coordinating council, except  
26 that (1) the legislative coordinating council may establish restrictions or  
27 limitations, or both, on travel expenses, subsistence expenses or allow-  
28 ances, or any combination thereof, paid to members and associate mem-  
29 bers of such advisory committee, and (2) any person who is an associate  
30 member of such advisory committee, by reason of such person having  
31 been accredited by the national conference of commissioners on uniform  
32 state laws as a life member of that organization, shall receive the same  
33 travel expenses and subsistence expenses for attendance at meetings of  
34 the advisory committee as a regular member, but shall receive no per  
35 diem compensation: *And provided further*, That expenditures may be  
36 made from this account for services, facilities and supplies provided for  
37 legislators in addition to those provided under the approved budget and  
38 for related copying, facsimile transmission and other services provided to  
39 persons other than legislators, in accordance with policies and any restric-  
40 tions or limitations prescribed by the legislative coordinating council: *And*  
41 *provided further*, That no expenditures shall be made from this account  
42 for any meeting of any joint committee of the legislature during fiscal  
43 year 2007 unless such meeting is approved by the legislative coordinating

1 council: *And provided further*, That no expenditures shall be made from  
 2 this account for any meeting of the compensation commission established  
 3 by K.S.A. 46-3101 and amendments thereto during fiscal year 2007: *And*  
 4 *provided further*, That expenditures shall be made during the fiscal year  
 5 ending June 30, 2007, from the operations (including official hospitality)  
 6 account of the state general fund by the legislature to pay per diem com-  
 7 pensation and travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allowances as  
 8 provided by law for members of the legislature for all official travel during  
 9 fiscal year 2007 authorized as provided by law: *And provided further*,  
 10 That, if the legislative coordinating council approves any official travel by  
 11 members of the legislature during fiscal year 2007, then the legislative  
 12 coordinating council shall not limit the amounts or rates of per diem  
 13 compensation or any expense reimbursement authorized by law for any  
 14 official travel during fiscal year 2007 authorized as provided by law, except  
 15 that any such member of the legislature shall be reimbursed for the actual  
 16 and reasonable expenses incurred during such official travel in an amount  
 17 of not more than the amount allowed for all other similarly situated em-  
 18 ployees: *And provided further*, That the legislative coordinating council  
 19 may establish limitations for the following specific categories of travel and  
 20 subsistence expenses: Meals, local transportation, tips and other related  
 21 incidental travel expenses, and may require legislators to agree to such  
 22 limitations as a condition of approval of the official travel.

23 (b) There is appropriated for the above agency from the following special  
 24 revenue fund or funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, all  
 25 moneys now or hereafter lawfully credited to and available in such fund  
 26 or funds, except that expenditures other than refunds authorized by law  
 27 shall not exceed the following:

29 *Provided*, That expenditures may be made from the legislative special  
 30 revenue fund, pursuant to vouchers approved by the chairperson or the  
 31 vice-chairperson of the legislative coordinating council, to pay compen-  
 32 sation and travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allowances as au-  
 33 thorized by K.S.A. 75-3212 and amendments thereto for members and  
 34 associate members of the advisory committee to the Kansas commission  
 35 on interstate cooperation established under K.S.A. 46-407a and amend-  
 36 ments thereto for attendance at meetings of the advisory committee  
 37 which are authorized by the legislative coordinating council, except that  
 38 (1) the legislative coordinating council may establish restrictions or limi-  
 39 tations, or both, on travel expenses, subsistence expenses or allowances,  
 40 or any combination thereof, paid to members and associate members of  
 41 such advisory committee, and (2) any person who is an associate member  
 42 of such advisory committee, by reason of such person having been ac-  
 43 credited by the national conference of commissioners on uniform state

1 laws as a life member of that organization, shall receive the same travel  
2 expenses and subsistence expenses for attendance at meetings of the ad-  
3 visory committee as a regular member, but shall receive no per diem  
4 compensation: *Provided further*, That expenditures may be made from  
5 this fund for services, facilities and supplies provided for legislators in  
6 addition to those provided under the approved budget and for related  
7 copying, facsimile transmission and other services provided to persons  
8 other than legislators, in accordance with policies and any restrictions or  
9 limitations prescribed by the legislative coordinating council: *And pro-*  
10 *vided further*, That amounts are hereby authorized to be collected for  
11 such services, facilities and supplies in accordance with policies of the  
12 council: *And provided further*, That such amounts shall be fixed in order  
13 to recover all or part of the expenses incurred for providing such services,  
14 facilities and supplies and shall be consistent with policies and fees estab-  
15 lished in accordance with K.S.A. 46-1207a and amendments thereto: *And*  
16 *provided further*, That all such amounts received shall be deposited in  
17 the state treasury in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215,  
18 and amendments thereto, and shall be credited to the legislative special  
19 revenue fund: *And provided further*, That all donations, gifts or bequests  
20 of money for the legislative branch of government which are received and  
21 accepted by the legislative coordinating council shall be deposited in the  
22 state treasury and credited to an account of the legislative special revenue  
23 fund: *And provided further*, That no expenditures shall be made from  
24 this fund for any meeting of any joint committee of the legislature during  
25 fiscal year 2007 unless such meeting is approved by the legislative coor-  
26 dinating council: *And provided further*, That no expenditures shall be  
27 made from this fund for any meeting of the compensation commission  
28 established by K.S.A. 46-3101 and amendments thereto during fiscal year  
29 2007: *And provided further*, That expenditures shall be made during the  
30 fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, from the legislative special revenue fund  
31 by the legislature to pay per diem compensation and travel expenses and  
32 subsistence expenses or allowances as provided by law for members of  
33 the legislature for all official travel during fiscal year 2007 authorized as  
34 provided by law: *And provided further*, That, if the legislative coordinat-  
35 ing council approves any official travel by members of the legislature  
36 during fiscal year 2007, then the legislative coordinating council shall not  
37 limit the amounts or rates of per diem compensation or any expense  
38 reimbursement authorized by law for any official travel during fiscal year  
39 2007 authorized as provided by law, except that any such member of the  
40 legislature shall be reimbursed for the actual and reasonable expenses  
41 incurred during such official travel in an amount of not more than the  
42 amount allowed for all other similarly situated employees: *And provided*  
43 *further*, That the legislative coordinating council may establish limitations

1 for the following specific categories of travel and subsistence expenses:  
2 Meals, local transportation, tips and other related incidental travel ex-  
3 penses, and may require legislators to agree to such limitations as a con-  
4 dition of approval of the official travel.

12 legislative post audit committee) account in excess of \$100 as of June 30,  
13 2006, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2007.

14 (b) There is appropriated for the above agency from the following spe-  
15 cial revenue fund or funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, all  
16 moneys now or hereafter lawfully credited to and available in such fund  
17 or funds, except that expenditures shall not exceed the following:

18 Audit services fund..... No limit

19 *Provided*, That the division of post audit is hereby authorized to fix, charge  
20 and collect fees for copies of public records of the division, including  
21 distribution of such copies: *Provided further*, That such fees shall be fixed  
22 to recover all or part of the expenses incurred for reproducing and dis-  
23 tributing such copies and shall be consistent with policies and fees estab-  
24 lished in accordance with K.S.A. 46-1207a and amendments thereto: *And*  
25 *provided further*, That all moneys received for such fees shall be depos-  
26 ited in the state treasury in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-  
27 4215, and amendments thereto, and shall be credited to the audit services  
28 fund.

32 GOVERNOR’S DEPARTMENT

33 (a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general  
34 fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, the following:

35 Governor’s department ..... \$2,271,303

36 *Provided*, That any unencumbered balance in the governor’s department  
37 account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2006, is hereby reappropriated  
38 for fiscal year 2007: *Provided further*, That expenditures may be made  
39 from this account for official hospitality and contingencies without limi-  
40 tation at the discretion of the governor.

41 (b) Expenditures may be made by the above agency for travel expenses  
42 of the governor’s spouse when accompanying the governor or when rep-  
43 resenting the governor on official state business, for travel and subsistence

1 expenditures for security personnel when traveling with the governor and  
2 for entertainment of officials and other persons as guests from the amount  
3 appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, by subsection (a)  
4 from the state general fund in the governor’s department account.

5 (c) There is appropriated for the above agency from the following spe-  
6 cial revenue fund or funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, all  
7 moneys now or hereafter lawfully credited to and available in such fund  
8 or funds, except that expenditures shall not exceed the following:

15 order to recover all or part of the operating expenses incurred for such  
16 conferences, including official hospitality: *And provided further*, That all  
17 fees received for such conferences and all fees received by the governor’s  
18 department under the open records act for providing access to or fur-  
19 nishing copies of public records, shall be deposited in the state treasury  
20 in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments

32 ments thereto, and shall be credited to the intergovernmental service  
33 fund.

40 911 grant fund for operating expenditures for the governor’s department,  
41 including conferences and official hospitality: *Provided further*, That the  
42 governor is hereby authorized to fix, charge and collect fees for such  
43 conferences: *And provided further*, That fees for such conferences shall

1 be fixed in order to recover all or part of the operating expenses incurred  
 2 for such conferences, including official hospitality: *And provided further,*  
 3 That all fees received for such conferences and all fees received by the  
 4 governor’s department under the open records act for providing access  
 5 to or furnishing copies of public records, shall be remitted to the state  
 6 treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215 and amend-  
 7 ments thereto: *And provided further,* That, upon receipt of each such  
 8 remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state  
 9 treasury to the credit of the wireless enhanced 911 grant fund.

 16 excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2006, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal  
 17 year 2007.

18 (b) Expenditures may be made by the above agency for travel expenses  
 19 of the lieutenant governor’s spouse when accompanying the lieutenant  
 20 governor on official state business and for travel and subsistence expend-  
 21 itures for security personnel when traveling with the lieutenant governor  
 22 on official state business from the amount appropriated by subsection (a)  
 23 from the state general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, in  
 24 the operations account.

25 (c) Expenditures may be made by the above agency for official hospi-  
 26 tality and contingencies from the amount appropriated by subsection (a)

 39 That the attorney general may make expenditures from this account for  
 40 the rent of office space in the memorial building.

36 such seminars, including official hospitality: *And provided further*, That  
37 all fees received for conducting such seminars shall be deposited in the  
38 state treasury in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and  
39 amendments thereto, and shall be credited to the attorney general's com-  
40 mittee on crime prevention fee fund.

4 olution No. 6003.

29 interest, including all moneys recovered as recoupment of expenses of  
30 investigation and prosecution, shall be deposited in the state treasury to  
31 the credit of the medicaid fraud prosecution revolving fund.
