

## SENATE BILL No. 666

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9 AN ACT concerning salaries and compensation for state officers and em-  
10 ployees; making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years end-  
11 ing June 30, 2009, June 30, 2010, June 30, 2011, June 30, 2012, and  
12 June 30, 2013; amending K.S.A. 40-102, 46-137a and 46-137b and  
13 K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 75-3101, 75-3103, 75-3104, 75-3108, 75-3110 and  
14 75-3111a and repealing the existing sections.  
15

16 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

17 New Section 1. (a) The governor is hereby authorized and directed to  
18 modify the pay plan for fiscal year 2009 in accordance with this subsection  
19 and to adopt such pay plan as so modified. The existing pay plan for fiscal  
20 year 2008 shall be modified to provide for (1) a base pay rate increase of  
21 2.5% in the pay rates of such pay plan, which shall be effective on the  
22 first day of the first biweekly payroll period which is chargeable to the  
23 fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, (2) additional modifications to imple-  
24 ment the recommendations of the state employee compensation oversight  
25 commission, including (A) the design, development and implementation  
26 of the five recommended pay plans, (B) development and implementation  
27 of a new statewide employee performance management system for clas-  
28 sified executive branch employees, and (C) performing market salary sur-  
29 veys on one-third of the executive branch classified workforce annually,  
30 and (3) market adjustments to the job classes determined to be signifi-  
31 cantly below market salary rates, which shall be effective on the first day  
32 of the first biweekly payroll period which is chargeable to the fiscal year  
33 ending June 30, 2009, for positions in such job classifications. The pay  
34 plan adopted by the governor under this subsection shall be the pay plan  
35 for the classified service under the Kansas civil service act and shall be  
36 effective on the first day of the first biweekly payroll period which is  
37 chargeable to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009. The pay plan adopted  
38 by the governor under this subsection for fiscal year 2009 shall be subject  
39 to modification and approval as provided under K.S.A. 75-2938, and  
40 amendments thereto, and to any enactment of the legislature applicable  
41 thereto.

42 (b) (1) The governor is hereby authorized to modify or authorize the  
43 modification of the salaries of state officers and employees who are in the

1 unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act and whose salaries  
2 are subject to approval by the governor under K.S.A. 75-2935b or 75-  
3 2935c, and amendments thereto, to provide for base salary increases, to  
4 be effective on the first day of the first payroll period which is chargeable  
5 to the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2009, and to be distributed from a  
6 salary increase pool, the average of such increases shall not exceed 2.5%  
7 of the base salaries of such officers and employees.

8 (2) Each elected state official of the executive branch of state govern-  
9 ment, including the state board of education, and the board of directors  
10 of the Kansas technology enterprise corporation, Kansas, Inc., the state  
11 board of regents and the board of trustees of the Kansas public employees  
12 retirement system, in each such official, corporation or board's discretion,  
13 are hereby authorized and directed to modify or to authorize the modi-  
14 fication of the salaries of the state officers and employees of such official,  
15 corporation or board, who are in the unclassified service under the Kansas  
16 civil service act and whose salaries are not subject to approval by the  
17 governor under K.S.A. 75-2935b, and amendments thereto, to provide  
18 for base salary increases to be effective on the first day of the first payroll  
19 period which is chargeable to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, and  
20 to be distributed from a salary increase pool, the average of such increases  
21 shall not exceed 2.5% of the base salaries of such officers and employees  
22 of such official, corporation or board. The provisions of this subsection  
23 (b)(2) shall not authorize or provide any salary increase for the governor,  
24 lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, commissioner of  
25 insurance, or attorney general, or for any member of any state board,  
26 commission, council or committee receiving per diem compensation as  
27 provided by statute.

28 (c) (1) During fiscal year 2009, each such state agency is hereby au-  
29 thorized and directed to provide each employee, who is eligible for a  
30 longevity bonus payment pursuant to K.S.A. 75-5541 and amendments  
31 thereto, an additional amount of longevity bonus payment during fiscal  
32 year 2009 equal to the amount required to provide, along with the amount  
33 of the longevity bonus payment otherwise payable pursuant to K.S.A. 75-  
34 5541, and amendments thereto, an aggregate amount of longevity bonus  
35 that would be payable if the amount of the longevity bonus payment  
36 pursuant to K.S.A. 75-5541, and amendments thereto were determined  
37 by multiplying the number of full years of state service, not to exceed 25  
38 years, rendered by such employee by \$50. The additional amount of lon-  
39 gevity bonus payment during fiscal year 2009 pursuant to this subsection  
40 (c) shall be made in the same manner and at the same time that the  
41 longevity bonus payment determined under K.S.A. 75-5541, and amend-  
42 ments thereto, is payable during fiscal year 2009 to such employee. Each  
43 such additional amount of longevity bonus payment to any such employee

1 shall be deemed to have the same characteristics, be subject to the same  
2 withholding, deduction or contribution requirements, and is intended to  
3 be a bonus as defined in 29 C.F.R. § 778.208, to the same extent and  
4 effect as longevity bonus payments that are payable pursuant to K.S.A.  
5 75-5541, and amendments thereto.

6 (2) As used in this subsection (c), “state agency” means any state agency  
7 in the executive branch, legislative branch or judicial branch of state gov-  
8 ernment and “employee” means any officer or employee of a state agency.

9 New Sec. 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated for the state finance  
10 council from the state general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
11 2009, the sum of \$38,575,818 to be used for the purpose of paying the  
12 proportionate share of the cost to the state general fund of: (1) The base  
13 salary increases which are provided for by modification of the pay plan  
14 for state officers and employees in the classified service under the Kansas  
15 civil service act to provide for an increase of 2.5% in the pay rates of such  
16 pay plan, including associated employer contributions, (2) market adjust-  
17 ments to the job classes determined to be significantly below market  
18 salary rates, which shall be effective on the first day of the first biweekly  
19 payroll period which is chargeable to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009,  
20 for positions in such job classifications, including associated employer  
21 contributions, (3) the salary increases for state officers and employees in  
22 the unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act which are pro-  
23 vided for in subsection (b)(1) and subsection (b)(2) of section 1 for bi-  
24 weekly pay periods which are chargeable to the fiscal year ending June  
25 30, 2009, including associated employer contributions, and (4) the addi-  
26 tional amount of longevity bonus payment provided for in subsection (c)  
27 of section 1 for each employee of a state agency who is eligible for a  
28 longevity bonus payment pursuant to K.S.A. 75-5541, and amendments  
29 thereto, during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, including associated  
30 employer contributions.

31 (b) To pay the proportionate share of the cost to the state general fund  
32 of each state agency for the salary increases and additional amounts of  
33 longevity bonus payment specified in subsection (a), including associated  
34 employer contributions, upon recommendation of the director of the  
35 budget, the state finance council, acting on this matter which is hereby  
36 characterized as a matter of legislative delegation and subject to the  
37 guidelines prescribed in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amend-  
38 ments thereto, except paragraph (3) of such subsection (c), is hereby  
39 authorized to approve the transfer of moneys from the appropriation un-  
40 der subsection (a) by the director of accounts and reports, who is hereby  
41 authorized and directed to make such transfers in accordance with such  
42 approval, to the proper accounts created by state general fund appropri-  
43 ations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

1 (c) (1) There is hereby appropriated for the state finance council from  
2 the state economic development initiatives fund for the fiscal year ending  
3 June 30, 2009, the sum of \$229,430 to be used for the purpose of paying  
4 the proportionate share of the cost to the state economic development  
5 initiatives fund of the salary increases and the additional amounts of lon-  
6 gevity bonus payment specified in subsection (a).

7 (2) To pay the proportionate share of the cost to the state economic  
8 development initiatives fund of each state agency for the salary increases  
9 and the additional amounts of longevity bonus payment specified in sub-  
10 section (a), including associated employer contributions, upon recom-  
11 mendation of the director of the budget, the state finance council, acting  
12 on this matter which is hereby characterized as a matter of legislative  
13 delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed in subsection (c) of  
14 K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, except paragraph (3) of such  
15 subsection (c), is hereby authorized to approve the transfer of moneys  
16 from the appropriation under subsection (c)(1) by the director of accounts  
17 and reports, who is hereby authorized and directed to make such transfers  
18 in accordance with such approval, to the proper accounts created by state  
19 economic development initiatives fund appropriations for the fiscal year  
20 ending June 30, 2009.

21 (d) (1) There is hereby appropriated for the state finance council from  
22 the state water plan fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the  
23 sum of \$47,029 to be used for the purpose of paying the proportionate  
24 share of the cost to the state water plan fund of the salary increases and  
25 the additional amounts of longevity bonus payment specified in subsec-  
26 tion (a).

27 (2) To pay the proportionate share of the cost to the state water plan  
28 fund of each state agency for the salary increases and the additional  
29 amounts of longevity bonus payment specified in subsection (a), including  
30 associated employer contributions, upon recommendation of the director  
31 of the budget, the state finance council, acting on this matter which is  
32 hereby characterized as a matter of legislative delegation and subject to  
33 the guidelines prescribed in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amend-  
34 ments thereto, except paragraph (3) of such subsection (c), is hereby  
35 authorized to approve the transfer of moneys from the appropriation un-  
36 der subsection (d)(1) by the director of accounts and reports, who is  
37 hereby authorized and directed to make such transfers in accordance with  
38 such approval, to the proper accounts created by state water plan fund  
39 appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

40 (e) Upon recommendation of the director of the budget, the state fi-  
41 nance council, acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a  
42 matter of legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed  
43 in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, except

1 paragraph (3) of such subsection (c), is hereby authorized to approve  
 2 increases in expenditure limitations on special revenue funds and ac-  
 3 counts established for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, by the director  
 4 of accounts and reports, who is hereby authorized and directed to increase  
 5 expenditure limitations on such special revenue funds and accounts in  
 6 accordance with such approval, for the purpose of paying from such funds  
 7 or accounts the proportionate share of the cost to such funds or accounts,  
 8 including associated employer contributions, of the salary increases and  
 9 additional amounts of longevity bonus payment specified in subsection  
 10 (a) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.

11 (f) The director of the budget, on behalf of the executive branch of  
 12 state government, shall prepare a budget estimate based upon the most  
 13 recent payroll information for the salary bonus payments and the salary  
 14 increases specified in subsection (a), and all amendments and revisions  
 15 of such estimate, and the director of the budget shall submit a copy of  
 16 such estimate, and all amendments and revisions thereof, directly to the  
 17 director of legislative research.

18 Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby appropriated for the state finance council  
 19 from the state general fund for the fiscal year or years specified, the  
 20 following:

26 *Provided*, That all moneys in the classified salary market adjustments  
 27 (including fringe benefits) account for each such fiscal year shall be used  
 28 for the purpose of paying the proportionate share of the cost to the state  
 29 general fund of the salary market adjustments, including associated em-  
 30 ployer contributions, for executive branch classified employees in posi-  
 31 tions in job classifications that are reassigned under the market adjust-  
 32 ment component during the fiscal year and, upon recommendation of the  
 33 director of the budget, the state finance council, acting on this matter  
 34 which is hereby characterized as a matter of legislative delegation and  
 35 subject to the guidelines prescribed in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c,  
 36 and amendments thereto, except paragraph (3) of such subsection (c), is  
 37 hereby authorized to approve the transfer of moneys from the appropri-  
 38 ation under this subsection (a) by the director of accounts and reports,  
 39 who is hereby authorized and directed to make such transfers in accord-  
 40 ance with each such approval, to the proper accounts created by state  
 41 general fund appropriations for the fiscal year for which such transfers  
 42 are so approved under this subsection (a).

43 (b) Upon recommendation of the director of the budget, the state fi-

1 nance council, acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a  
 2 matter of legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed  
 3 in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c, and amendments thereto, except  
 4 paragraph (3) of such subsection (c), is hereby authorized to approve  
 5 increases in expenditure limitations on special revenue funds and ac-  
 6 counts established for each fiscal year designated in subsection (a), for  
 7 each such fiscal year, commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30,  
 8 2009, by the director of accounts and reports, who is hereby authorized  
 9 and directed to increase expenditure limitations on such special revenue  
 10 funds and accounts in accordance with such approval, for the purpose of  
 11 paying from such funds or accounts the proportionate share of the cost  
 12 to such funds or accounts, including associated employer contributions,  
 13 of the salary increases and other amounts specified in subsection (a) for  
 14 each such fiscal year, commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30,  
 15 2009.

16 (c) The director of the budget, on behalf of the executive branch of  
 17 state government, shall prepare a budget estimate based upon the most  
 18 recent payroll information for the salary increases and other amounts  
 19 specified in subsection (a), and all amendments and revisions of such  
 20 estimate, and the director of the budget shall submit a copy of such es-  
 21 timate, and all amendments and revisions thereof, directly to the director  
 22 of legislative research.

7 Sec. 9. On June 15, 2008, K.S.A. 40-102 is hereby amended to read as  
 8 follows: 40-102. There is hereby established a department to be known  
 9 as the insurance department, which shall have a chief officer entitled the  
 10 commissioner of insurance who shall receive, except as otherwise pro-  
 11 vided in K.S.A. 75-3111a and amendments thereto, a salary at a biweekly  
 12 pay rate of ~~\$2,648.45~~ \$3,307.81, and such officer shall be charged with  
 13 the administration of all laws relating to insurance, insurance companies  
 14 and fraternal benefit societies doing business in this state, and all other  
 15 duties which are or may be imposed upon such officer by law.

16 Sec. 10. On June 15, 2008, K.S.A. 46-137a is hereby amended to read  
 17 as follows: 46-137a. In addition to the compensation provided for by  
 18 K.S.A. 46-137b, 46-137e and 75-3212, and amendments thereto, each

 33 ~~cludes~~ April 1st and for each of the 19 ensuing two-week periods there-  
 34 after, to defray expenses incurred between sessions of the legislature for  
 35 postage, telephone, office and other incidental expenses, *except as oth-*  
 36 *erwise provided in subsection (f)*;

37 (d) an allowance for mileage in an amount equal to the rate per mile  
 38 prescribed under the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3203a, and amendments  
 39 thereto, multiplied by the number of miles traveled by the usual route in  
 40 going to and returning from the member's place of residence for any  
 41 regular or special session of the legislature. Such mileage allowances shall  
 42 be paid for not to exceed the equivalent of one trip for each full week  
 43 occurring between convening and adjournment sine die in any regular or

1 special session. The mileage allowance provided under the provisions of  
 2 this subsection shall not be subject to the restrictions relating to the use  
 3 of vehicles prescribed by K.S.A. 75-3203 and 75-3203a, and amendments  
 4 thereto, but shall only be allowed for trips actually made. Compensation  
 5 and subsistence allowance shall not be allowed under the provisions of  
 6 subsections (a) and (b) of this section during any period in which the  
 7 legislature is adjourned for more than two days, Sundays excepted; and

8 (e) whenever the rates of compensation of the pay plan for persons in  
 9 the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for  
 10 payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years commencing after June 30, ~~1999~~  
 11 2009, the rate of compensation per calendar day for members of the  
 12 legislature for service at any regular or special session of the legislature  
 13 shall be increased on the effective date of any such pay plan increase by  
 14 an amount computed by multiplying the average of the percentage in-  
 15 creases in all steps of such pay plan by the rate of compensation per  
 16 calendar day which is authorized by this section for service at any regular  
 17 or special session of the legislature for the day upon which such increase  
 18 is computed.

19 (f) *Whenever the rates of compensation of the pay plan for persons in*  
 20 *the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for*  
 21 *payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years commencing after June 30, 2009,*  
 22 *the allowance provided for each member of the legislature by subsection*  
 23 *(c) to defray expenses incurred between sessions of the legislature for*  
 24 *postage, telephone, office and other incidental expenses for each of the*  
 25 *two-week periods specified by subsection (c) shall be increased on the*  
 26 *effective date of any such pay plan increase by an amount computed by*  
 27 *multiplying the average of the percentage increases in all steps of such*  
 28 *pay plan by the allowance provided to defray such expenses for each such*  
 29 *two-week period as provided by this section.*

30 Sec. 11. On June 15, 2008, K.S.A. 46-137b is hereby amended to read  
 31 as follows: 46-137b. (a) In addition to the compensation provided for by  
 32 K.S.A. 46-137a and 75-3212, and amendments thereto, and any other  
 33 statute, and except as otherwise provided by subsection (b):

34 (1) The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of rep-  
 35 resentatives shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay rate of  
 36 ~~\$438.82~~ \$539.97 during their terms of office as speaker and president,  
 37 which compensation shall be for additional services performed in con-  
 38 nection with discharging the duties assigned to the respective positions;

39 (2) the speaker pro tem of the house of representatives, the vice pres-  
 40 ident of the senate, the assistant majority leaders of the senate and house  
 41 of representatives and the assistant minority leaders of the senate and  
 42 house of representatives shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay  
 43 rate of ~~\$223.97~~ \$275.59 during their respective terms of office which

1 compensation shall be for additional services performed in connection  
2 with discharging the duties assigned to the respective positions;

3 (3) the chairperson of the senate committee on ways and means and  
4 the chairperson of the house committee on appropriations shall each re-  
5 ceive an allowance at a biweekly pay rate of ~~\$352.89~~ \$434.23 during their  
6 respective terms of office, which compensation shall be for additional  
7 services performed in connection with discharging the duties assigned to  
8 the respective positions; and

9 (4) the majority and minority leaders of the senate and the house of  
10 representatives shall each receive an allowance at a biweekly pay rate of  
11 ~~\$395.89~~ \$487.14 during their respective terms of office, which compen-  
12 sation shall be for additional services performed in connection with dis-  
13 charging the duties assigned to the respective positions.

14 (b) Whenever the rates of compensation of the pay plan for persons in  
15 the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for  
16 payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years commencing after June 30, ~~1999~~  
17 2009, the biweekly pay rate of officers of the legislature specified in sub-  
18 section (a) shall be increased on the effective date of any such pay plan  
19 increase by an amount computed by multiplying the average of the per-  
20 centage increases in all steps of such pay plan by the biweekly pay rate  
21 of such officers which is being received as provided by law and which is  
22 in effect prior to the effective date of such pay plan increase.

23 Sec. 12. On June 15, 2008, K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 75-3101 is hereby  
24 amended to read as follows: 75-3101. Except as otherwise provided in  
25 K.S.A. 75-3111a and amendments thereto, the governor of the state shall  
26 receive for services a salary at a biweekly pay rate of ~~\$3,409.22~~ \$4,257.97.

27 Sec. 13. On June 15, 2008, K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 75-3103 is hereby  
28 amended to read as follows: 75-3103. (a) The lieutenant governor shall  
29 receive, as reimbursement for expenses the following: (1) Biweekly the  
30 sum of ~~\$72.12~~ \$76.91, *except as otherwise provided in subsection (c)*, and  
31 (2) when attending the duties of office or attending any authorized meet-  
32 ing, in addition to other provisions of this section, travel expenses and  
33 subsistence expenses and allowances in amounts equal to those provided  
34 for by K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto.

35 In addition to any other compensation provided by law and except as  
36 otherwise provided in K.S.A. 75-3111a, and amendments thereto, the  
37 lieutenant governor shall also receive for services in the performance of  
38 duties imposed by law compensation at the biweekly pay rate of ~~\$964.29~~  
39 \$1,204.35. While acting as governor, the lieutenant governor shall receive  
40 the same salary as the governor. The lieutenant governor may appoint an  
41 administrative assistant and office and stenographic employees, all of  
42 whom shall be in the unclassified service of the Kansas civil service act.  
43 Such administrative assistant shall receive travel expenses and subsistence

1 expenses or allowances as provided by K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments  
2 thereto, when traveling as authorized by the lieutenant governor.

3 (b) If the lieutenant governor is appointed by the governor under the  
4 provision of K.S.A. 75-303, and amendments thereto, the lieutenant gov-  
5 ernor shall receive a salary to be fixed by the governor or a salary as  
6 provided for in subsection (a) of this section, whichever is greater.

7 (c) *Whenever the rates of compensation of the pay plan for persons in*  
8 *the classified service under the Kansas civil service act are increased for*  
9 *payroll periods chargeable to fiscal years commencing after June 30, 2009,*  
10 *the sum provided biweekly for reimbursement of expenses pursuant to*  
11 *subsection (a)(1) for the lieutenant governor shall be increased on the*  
12 *effective date of any such pay plan increase by an amount computed by*  
13 *multiplying the average of the percentage increases in all steps of such*  
14 *pay plan by the biweekly sum provided to the lieutenant governor for*  
15 *reimbursement of expenses as authorized by this section.*

16 Sec. 14. On June 15, 2008, K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 75-3104 is hereby  
17 amended to read as follows: 75-3104. Except as otherwise provided in
