9 AN ACT concerning pesticides; creating the pesticide safety and edu-
10 cation fee fund.

12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

13 Section 1. The secretary of the department of agriculture shall remit
14 all moneys received pursuant to section 2 or section 3, and amendments
15 thereto, to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A.
16 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance,
17 the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury
18 to the credit of the pesticide safety and education fee fund, which is
19 hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the pesticide
20 safety and education fee fund shall be expended solely for costs incurred
21 by Kansas cooperative extension services pursuant to K.S.A. 2-2459a, and
22 amendments thereto. All expenditures from the pesticide safety and edu-
23 cation fee fund shall be made in accordance with appropriations acts
24 upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to
25 vouchers approved by the dean of the college of agriculture of Kansas
26 state university, or the dean's designee.

27 Sec. 2. In addition to the examination fee prescribed by K.S.A. 2-
28 443a, and amendments thereto, applicants for a commercial applicator's
29 certificate shall submit along with each examination application a pesti-
30 cide safety and education fee in an amount not to exceed \$20.

31 Sec. 3. In addition to the recertification-by-training fee prescribed
32 by K.S.A. 2-2446, and amendments thereto, commercial applicators shall
33 submit along with each renewal application a pesticide safety and edu-
34 cation fee in an amount not to exceed \$20.

35 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
36 publication in the statute book.
