9 AN ACT concerning wildlife and parks; relating to hunting licenses; ex-
10 empting prisoners of war from paying hunting license fees; amending
11 K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 32-988 and repealing the existing section.

13 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

14 Section 1. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 32-988 is hereby amended to read as
15 follows: 32-988. (a) The secretary is authorized to adopt, in accordance
16 with K.S.A. 32-805 and amendments thereto, rules and regulations fixing
17 the amount of fees for the following items, subject to the following lim-
18 itations and subject to the requirement that no such rules and regulations
19 shall be adopted as temporary rules and regulations:

20 Big game permits

21 Resident (other than elk permit): maximum \$100

22 Nonresident (other than elk permit): maximum \$400

23 Elk permit: maximum \$350

24 Nonresident mule deer stamp: maximum \$150

25 Nonresident applications: maximum \$25

26 Combination hunting and fishing licenses

27 Resident: maximum \$50

28 Lifetime: maximum \$1,000; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$150

29 Nonresident: maximum \$200

30 Commercial dog training permits: maximum \$25

31 Commercial guide permit or associate guide permit

32 Resident: maximum \$250

33 Nonresident: maximum \$1,000

34 Commercial harvest or dealer permits: maximum \$200

35 Commercial prairie rattlesnake harvesting permits

36 Resident or nonresident with valid hunting license: maximum \$5

37 Resident or nonresident nonfirearm without valid hunting license: maximum \$20

38 Controlled shooting area operator license: maximum \$400

39 Duplicate licenses, permits, stamps and other issues of the department: maximum \$10

40 Falconry

41 Permits: maximum \$300

42 Examinations: maximum \$100

43 Field trial permits: maximum \$25

- 1 Fishing licenses
- 2 Resident: maximum \$25
- 3 Lifetime: maximum \$500; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$75
- 4 Nonresident: maximum \$75
- 5 Five-day nonresident: maximum \$25
- 6 Institutional group: maximum \$200
- 7 Special nonprofit group: maximum \$200
- 8 Twenty-four-hour: maximum \$10
- 9 Fur dealer licenses
- 10 Resident: maximum \$200
- 11 Nonresident: maximum \$400
- 12 Furharvester licenses
- 13 Resident: maximum \$25
- 14 Lifetime: maximum \$500; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$75
- 15 Nonresident: maximum \$400
- 16 Game breeder permits: maximum \$15
- 17 Handicapped hunting and fishing permits: maximum \$5
- 18 Hound trainer-breeder running permits: maximum \$25
- 19 Hunting licenses
- 20 Resident: maximum \$25
- 21 Lifetime: maximum \$500; or 8 quarterly payments, each maximum \$75
- 22 Nonresident 16 or more years of age: maximum \$125
- 23 Nonresident under 16 years of age: maximum \$75
- 24 Controlled shooting area: maximum \$25
- 25 Forty-eight-hour waterfowl permits: maximum \$25
- 26 Migratory waterfowl habitat stamps: maximum \$8
- 27 Mussel fishing licenses
- 28 Resident: maximum \$200
- 29 Nonresident: maximum \$1,500
- 30 Rabbit permits
- 31 Live trapping: maximum \$200
- 32 Shipping: maximum \$400
- 33 Raptor propagation permits: maximum \$100
- 34 Rehabilitation permits: maximum \$50
- 35 Scientific, educational or exhibition permits: maximum \$10
- 36 Wildlife damage control permits: maximum \$10
- 37 Wildlife importation permits: maximum \$10
- 38 Wild turkey permits
- 39 Resident: maximum \$100
- 40 Nonresident: maximum \$400
- 41 Resident turkey tag: maximum \$20
- 42 Nonresident turkey tag: maximum \$30
- 43 Special permits under K.S.A. 32-961: maximum \$100

- 1 Miscellaneous fees
- 2 Special events on department land or water: maximum \$200
- 3 Special departmental services, materials or supplies: no maximum
- 4 Other issues of department: no maximum
- 5 Vendor bond: no maximum
- 6 (b) The fee for a landowner-tenant resident big game or wild turkey
- 7 hunting permit shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a general res-
- 8 ident big game or wild turkey hunting permit.
- 9 (c) The fee for a big game or wild turkey hunting permit for a resident
- 10 under 16 years of age shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a general
- 11 resident big game or wild turkey hunting permit.
- 12 (d) The fee for a furharvester license for a resident under 16 years
- 13 of age shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a resident furharvester
- 14 license.
- 15 (e) *Any person who was held as a prisoner of war while serving in*
- 16 *the army, navy, coast guard, air force or marine corps of the United States,*
- 17 *shall be exempt from the license fees listed in subsection (a). The secretary*
- 18 *shall exempt a person from the license fees listed in subsection (a) only*
- 19 *after receiving sufficient documentation that the license applicant has*
- 20 *been declared to be a prisoner of war, as established by the United States*
- 21 *secretary of defense.*
- 22 (f) The secretary may establish, by rules and regulations adopted in
- 23 accordance with K.S.A. 32-805 and amendments thereto, different fees
- 24 for various classes and types of licenses, permits, stamps and other issu-
- 25 ances of the department which may occur within each item as described
- 26 under subsection (a).
- 27 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 32-988 is hereby repealed.
- 28 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
- 29 publication in the statute book.
