9 AN ACT concerning elections; pertaining to voter identification; pertain-
10 ing to advance voting; pertaining to HAVA compliance; pertaining to
11 mail ballot elections; pertaining to party affiliation declarations;
12 amending K.S.A. 25-2354 and 25-3304 and K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 25-433
13 25-1122, 25-1122d, 25-1123, 25-1124, 25-1128, 25-1216, 25-2309, 25-
14 2908 and 25-3002 and repealing the existing sections.
15

16 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

17 Section 1. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 25-433 is hereby amended to read as
18 follows: 25-433. (a) The county election officer shall mail all official ballots
19 with a return identification envelope and instructions sufficient to de-
20 scribe the voting process to each elector entitled to vote in the election
21 on one date not sooner than the 20th day before the date of the election
22 and not later than the 10th day before the date of the election.

23 (b) *The county election officer shall provide with the ballot a notice*
24 *to the voter indicating that the voter must submit a valid form of identi-*
25 *fication to the county election office with such voter's ballot, or shall pro-*
26 *vide a valid form of identification by mail or electronic means before the*
27 *meeting of the county board of canvassers.*

28 (c) *Valid identification shall include:*

29 (1) *a current and valid Kansas driver's license number or nondriver's*
30 *identification card number, or*

31 (2) *the last four digits of the voter's social security number, or*

32 (3) *a copy of a current and valid Kansas driver's license or nondriver's*
33 *identification card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government*
34 *check or other government document containing, at a minimum, the*
35 *voter's current name and either the voter's photograph or the voter's cur-*
36 *rent residential address as indicated on the registration book.*

37 (d) Ballots mailed by the county election officer shall be addressed
38 to the address of each elector appearing in the registration records, and
39 placed in an envelope which is prominently marked "Do Not Forward."
40 Ballots shall not be mailed to any inactive voter who, based on information
41 provided by the postal service, appears to have moved to a residence
42 address outside the county in which the voter is currently registered and
43 who has been mailed a confirmation notice as described in subparagraph

1 (4) of subsection (e) of K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, or
2 because a “Forwarding Order Expired” or “Moved — No Forwarding
3 Address” notice was received from the post office. Any inactive voter who
4 believes such voter is entitled to vote in the election may request a re-
5 placement ballot as provided for in subsection ~~(d)~~ (g) of this section.

6 ~~(b)~~ (e) Upon receipt of the ballot the elector shall mark it, sign the
7 return identification envelope supplied with the ballot and comply with
8 the instructions provided with the ballot. The elector may return the
9 marked ballot to the county election officer by United States mail, if it is
10 received by the county election officer by the date of the election, or
11 personally deliver the ballot to the office of the county election officer
12 before noon on the date of the election. The ballot shall be returned in
13 the return identification envelope. The county election officer shall provide
14 for the payment of postage for the return of ballot envelopes.

15 ~~(c)~~ (f) The return identification envelope shall contain the following
16 form:

17 I declare under penalty of election perjury, a felony, that I am a resident and a
18 qualified voter for this election as shown on voter registration records and that I have
19 voted the enclosed ballot and am returning it in compliance with Kansas law, and amend-
20 ments thereto, and have not and will not vote more than one ballot in this election.

21 I understand that I must provide one of the following forms of identification with this
22 application in order to have my ballot count:

- 23 (1) A current and valid Kansas driver’s license number or nondriver’s identification
- 24 card number; or
- 25 (2) the last four digits of my social security number; or
- 26 (3) a copy of a current and valid Kansas driver’s license or nondriver’s identification
- 27 card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government
- 28 document that shows, at a minimum, my current name and either my photograph or my
- 29 current residential address as indicated on the registration book.

30 I also understand that failure to complete the information below will invalidate my
31 ballot.

36 ~~(d)~~ (g) If the ballot is destroyed, spoiled, lost or not received by the
37 elector, the elector may obtain a replacement ballot from the county
38 election officer as provided in this subsection. An elector seeking a re-
39 placement ballot shall sign a statement verified on oath or affirmation, on
40 a form prescribed by the secretary of state, that the ballot was destroyed,
41 spoiled, lost or not received. The applicant shall deliver the statement to
42 the county election officer before noon on the date of the election. The
43 applicant may mail the statement to the county election officer, except a

1 county election officer shall not transmit a ballot by mail under this sub-
 2 section unless the application is received prior to the close of business on
 3 the second day prior to the election. When an application is timely re-
 4 ceived under this subsection, the county election officer shall deliver the
 5 ballot to the voter if the voter is present in the office of the county election
 6 officer, or promptly transmit the ballot by mail to the voter at the address
 7 contained in the application, except when prohibited in this subsection.
 8 The county election officer shall keep a record of each replacement ballot
 9 provided under this subsection.

10 (h) *The county election officer shall compare the driver's license num-*
 11 *ber, nondriver's identification card number, social security number or*
 12 *copy of other valid identification provided by each voter to the voter*
 13 *registration list verified by the division of motor vehicles in accordance*
 14 *with K.S.A. 25-2354, and amendments thereto. If no identification infor-*
 15 *mation was provided by the voter, or if such information does not match*
 16 *the information on the verified voter registration list, the county election*
 17 *officer shall challenge such ballot as provided by K.S.A. 25-414, and*
 18 *amendments thereto, and shall present such ballot to the county board of*
 19 *canvassers along with other provisional ballots. If the canvassers deter-*
 20 *mine that the provisional ballot was properly cast, the ballot shall be*
 21 *counted.*

22 ~~(e)~~ (i) A ballot shall be counted only if: ~~(1) It is returned in the return~~
 23 ~~identification envelope; (2) the envelope is signed by the elector to whom~~
 24 ~~the ballot is issued; and (3) the signature has been verified as provided~~
 25 ~~in this subsection.~~

26 (1) *It is returned in the return identification envelope;*
 27 (2) *the envelope is signed by the elector to whom the ballot is issued;*
 28 (3) *the voter has provided valid identification; and*
 29 (4) *the signature has been verified as provided in this subsection.*

30 The county election officer shall verify the signature of each elector on
 31 the return identification envelope with the signature on the elector's reg-
 32 istration records and may commence verification at any time prior to the
 33 canvass of the election. If the county election officer determines that an
 34 elector to whom a replacement ballot has been issued under subsection
 35 ~~(d)~~ (g) has voted more than once, the county election officer shall not
 36 count any ballot cast by that elector.

37 ~~(f)~~ (j) The county election officer shall supervise the procedures for
 38 the handling and canvassing of ballots to insure the safety and confiden-
 39 tiality of all ballots properly cast.

40 ~~(g)~~ (k) The names of voters whose mail ballot envelopes are returned
 41 to the county election officer as "undeliverable" shall be subject to re-
 42 moval from the voter registration book and party affiliation list in the
 43 manner provided in subsection (d) of K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments

1 thereto.

2 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as
3 follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county elec-
4 tion officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is
5 authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for
6 an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only
7 to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as
8 otherwise provided by law.

9 (b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to
10 be transmitted in person, ~~and such voter is a first-time voter~~, such voter
11 shall provide a form of valid identification such as a current and valid
12 Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank
13 statement, paycheck, government check or other government document
14 ~~containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the reg-~~
15 ~~istration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification~~
16 ~~if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in~~
17 ~~the county where registered. The identification document provided in~~
18 ~~accordance with this section shall contain, at a minimum, the voter's cur-~~
19 ~~rent name and either the voter's photograph or the voter's current resi-~~
20 ~~dential address as indicated on the registration book.~~

21 (c) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to
22 be transmitted by mail, ~~and such voter is a first-time voter~~, such voter
23 shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot the voter's
24 current and valid Kansas driver's license number, nondriver's identifica-
25 tion card number or the last four digits of the voter's social security num-
26 ber, or shall provide with the application a copy of the voter's current and
27 valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill,
28 bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government doc-
29 ument containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on
30 the registration book. ~~Such voter shall not be required to provide iden-~~
31 ~~tification if such voter has previously provided current and valid identi-~~
32 ~~fication in the county where registered.~~

33 (d) If a ~~first-time~~ voter is unable or refuses to provide current and
34 valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's
35 name and address on the registration book, the voter may vote a provi-
36 sional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and amendments thereto. The
37 voter shall provide a valid form of identification as defined in subsection
38 (c) of this section to the county election officer in person or provide a
39 copy by mail or electronic means before the meeting of the county board
40 of canvassers. ~~At the meeting of the county board of canvassers the county~~
41 ~~election officer shall present copies of identification received from pro-~~
42 ~~visional voters and the corresponding provisional ballots.~~ If the county
43 board of canvassers determines that a voter's identification is valid and

1 the provisional ballot was properly cast, the ballot shall be counted.

2 (e) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to the
3 voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times:

4 (1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August
5 in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last busi-
6 ness day of the week preceding such primary election.

7 (2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the
8 first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days
9 prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding
10 such general election.

11 (3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first Tues-
12 day in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last
13 business day of the week preceding such primary election.

14 (4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April,
15 between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day
16 of the week preceding such general election.

17 (5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a pri-
18 mary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election
19 of officers at such election.

20 (6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a
21 primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice
22 thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question
23 submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held
24 on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine
25 the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shall
26 not be more than three business days before such election.

27 (7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by
28 the secretary of state.

29 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 of
30 the year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the
31 week preceding such primary election.

32 The county election officer of any county may receive applications prior
33 to the time specified in this subsection ~~(e)~~ and hold such applications
34 until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such applications
35 shall be treated as filed on that date.

36 (f) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office,
37 applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person
38 in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the Tuesday
39 next preceding the election and on each subsequent business day until
40 no later than 12:00 noon on the day preceding such election. If the county
41 election officer so provides, applications for advance voting ballots trans-
42 mitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer
43 also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election. Upon receipt

1 of any such properly executed application, the county election officer shall
2 deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are provided for in
3 this act.

4 An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a
5 temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the
6 English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may
7 be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the
8 close of the polls on election day.

9 The county election officer may designate places other than the central
10 county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite
11 advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for ad-
12 vance voting ballots. Such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to
13 the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as
14 otherwise provided by this subsection.

15 (g) (1) Any person having a permanent disability or an illness which
16 has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to make
17 an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications for per-
18 manent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such in-
19 formation as is required for application for advance voting ballots and also
20 shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to permanent
21 advance voting status.

22 (2) *Any person applying for permanent advance voter status shall*
23 *submit valid identification as provided in subsection (b) or (c) of this*
24 *section. Once such permanent advance voter has provided valid identi-*
25 *fication, or if such voter's registration has been verified pursuant to K.S.A.*
26 *25-2354, and amendments thereto, such voter shall not be required to*
27 *provide identification in subsequent elections unless the voter:*

28 (A) *Moves to another county or state;*

29 (B) *is removed from the registration list and re-registers; or*

30 (C) *is removed from the permanent advance voter list.*

31 (h) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this
32 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such
33 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such
34 applications, together with their correct post office address and the pre-
35 cinct, ward, township or voting area in which such persons claim to be
36 registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct
37 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names
38 and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The
39 county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and
40 addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All
41 such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance
42 with this subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours.
43 The county election officer upon receipt of such applications shall enter

1 upon a record kept by such officer the name and address of each appli-
 2 cant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before in-
 3 spection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring
 4 to make such inspection shall provide to the county election officer iden-
 5 tification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and
 6 shall sign a log book or application form maintained by such officer stating
 7 such person's name and address and showing the date and time of in-
 8 spection. All records made by the county election officer shall be subject
 9 to public inspection, except that the voter identification information re-
 10 quired by subsections (b) and (c) and the identifying number on ballots
 11 and ballot envelopes and records of such numbers shall not be made
 12 public.

13 (i) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote in
 14 two consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the
 15 first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, the county elec-
 16 tion officer may mail a notice to such voter. Such notice shall inform the
 17 voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent advance
 18 voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent advance
 19 voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the voter fails to
 20 renew such application, the county election officer shall remove the
 21 voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure to renew
 22 the application for permanent advance voting status shall not result in
 23 removal of the voter's name from the voter registration list.

24 ~~(j) For the purposes of this section, "first-time voter" means a reg-~~
 25 ~~istered voter who has not previously voted in any election in the county~~
 26 ~~in which the voter desires to vote. First-time voter includes a person~~
 27 ~~whose name was removed from the county registration list in accordance~~
 28 ~~with K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and who has re-regis-~~
 29 ~~tered.~~

30 ~~(k)~~ (j) The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations defining
 31 valid forms of identification.

4 tion shall contain an affirmation concerning substantially the same infor-
5 mation required in subsection (a) and in addition thereto a statement
6 regarding the permanent character of such illness or disability.
7 (d) Any application by a former precinct resident shall state both the
8 former and present residence, address, precinct and county of such for-
9 mer precinct resident and the date of change of residence. *Such appli-*
10 *cation shall include an affirmation containing substantially the same in-*
11 *formation required by subsection (a) and shall be accompanied by valid*
12 *identification as provided in subsection (a).*
13 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 25-1123 is hereby amended to read as
14 follows: 25-1123. (a) When an application for an advance voting ballot has
15 been filed in accordance with K.S.A. 25-1122, and amendments thereto,
16 the county election officer shall transmit to the voter applying therefor
17 one each of the appropriate ballots. Except as provided by subsection (b),
18 the county election officer shall transmit the advance voting ballots to the
19 voter at one of the following addresses as specified by the voter on such
20 application: (1) The voter's residential address or mailing address as in-
21 dicated on the registration list; (2) the voter's temporary residential ad-
22 dress; or (3) a medical care facility as defined in K.S.A. 65-425, and
23 amendments thereto, psychiatric hospital, hospice or adult care home
24 where the voter resides. No advance voting ballot shall be transmitted by
25 the county election officer by any means prior to the 20th day before the
26 election for which an application for an advance voting ballot has been
27 received by such county election officer. If the advance voting ballot is
28 transmitted by mail, such ballot shall be transmitted with printed instruc-
29 tions prescribed by the secretary of state and a ballot envelope bearing
30 upon the outside a printed form as described in K.S.A. 25-1120, and
31 amendments thereto, and the same number as the number of the ballot.
32 If the advance voting ballot is transmitted to the applicant in person in
33 the office of the county election officer or at a satellite advance voting
34 site, such advance voting ballot and printed instructions shall be trans-
35 mitted in an advance voting ballot envelope bearing upon the outside a
36 printed form as described in K.S.A. 25-1120, and amendments thereto,
37 and the same number as the number of the ballot unless the voter elects
38 to deposit the advance voting ballot into a locked ballot box without an
39 envelope. All ballots shall be transmitted to the advance voting voter not
40 more than 20 days before the election but within two business days of
41 the receipt of such voter's application by the election officer or the com-
42 mencement of such 20-day period. In primary elections required to be
43 conducted on a partisan basis, the election officer shall deliver to such

1 voter the ballot of the political party of the applicant.

2 (b) The restrictions in subsection (a) relating to where a county elec-
3 tion officer may transmit an advance voting ballot shall not apply to an
4 advance voting ballot requested pursuant to an application for an advance
5 voting ballot filed by a voter who has a temporary illness or disability or
6 who is not proficient in reading the English language.

7 (c) The *secretary of state or the* county election officer shall compare
8 the driver's license number, nondriver's identification card number, social
9 security number or copy of other valid identification provided by ~~a first-~~
10 ~~time voter~~ *each applicant for an advance voting ballot to be transmitted*
11 *by mail* to the voter registration list verified by the division of motor
12 vehicles in accordance with ~~federal law~~ K.S.A. 25-2354 *and amendments*
13 *thereto*. If no identification information was provided by the ~~first-time~~
14 voter, or if such information does not match the information on the *ver-*
15 *ified* voter registration list, the county election officer shall ~~not transmit~~
16 ~~an advance voting ballot.~~ *issue a provisional ballot to such voter in ac-*
17 *cordance with K.S.A. 25-409 and amendments thereto. The county elec-*
18 *tion officer shall provide with the ballot a notice to the voter indicating:*
19 *(1) That the advance voting ballot is provisional; (2) that the voter may*
20 *submit a valid form of identification to the county election office before*
21 *the meeting of the county board of canvassers; and (3) how the voter may*
22 *ascertain whether the voter's provisional ballot was counted and, if such*
23 *ballot was not counted, the reason therefor.*

24 *The voter shall provide a valid form of identification as defined in sub-*
25 *section (c) of K.S.A. 25-1122, and amendments thereto, to the county*
26 *election officer in person or provide a copy by mail or electronic means*
27 *before the meeting of the county board of canvassers. If the county board*
28 *of canvassers determines that the provisional ballot was properly cast, the*
29 *ballot shall be counted.*

30 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 25-1124 is hereby amended to read as
31 follows: 25-1124. (a) Upon receipt of the advance voting ballot, the voter
32 shall cast such voter's vote as follows: The voter shall make a cross or
33 check mark in the square or parentheses opposite the name of each can-
34 didate or question for whom the voter desires to vote. The voter shall
35 make no other mark, and shall allow no other person to make any mark,
36 upon such ballot. If the advance voting ballot was transmitted by mail,
37 the voter personally shall place the ballot in the ballot envelope bearing
38 the same number as the ballot and seal the envelope. The voter shall
39 complete the form on the ballot envelope and shall sign the same. Except
40 as provided by K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto, the ballot en-
41 velope shall be mailed or otherwise transmitted to the county election
42 officer. If the advance voting ballot was transmitted to the voter in person
43 in the office of the county election officer or at a satellite advance voting

1 site, the voter may deposit such ballot into a locked ballot box without an
2 envelope.

3 (b) Any sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter who is unable to
4 apply for or mark or transmit an advance voting ballot, may request as-
5 sistance by a person who has signed a statement required by subsection
6 (d) in applying for or marking an advance voting ballot.

7 (c) Any voted ballot may be transmitted to the county election officer
8 by the voter or by another person ~~upon request of~~ *designated in writing*
9 *by* the voter. Any such voted ballot shall be transmitted to the county
10 election officer before the close of the polls on election day.

11 (d) The county election officer shall allow a person to assist a sick,
12 physically disabled or illiterate voter in applying for or marking an appli-
13 cation or advance voting ballot, provided a written statement is signed by
14 the person who renders assistance to the sick, physically disabled or illit-
15 erate voter and submitted to the county election officer with the appli-
