INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

The following bills were introduced and read by title:

HB 2747, An act relating to port authorities; amending K.S.A. 12-3402 and 12-3420 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Transportation.

HB 2748, An act amending the health care provider insurance availability act; concerning coverage documentation and surcharge payment due date; providing for payment of interest; amending K.S.A. 40-3402 and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 40-3404 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Insurance.

HB 2749, An act amending the health care provider insurance availability act; concerning the board of governors; providing for certain investments; disclosure of certain information; amending K.S.A. 40-3406 and 40-3413 and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 40-3403 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Insurance.

HB 2750, An act concerning livestock; relating to disposition of certain animals; indemnity; amending K.S.A. 47-612 and 47-615 and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 47-617 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Agriculture.

HB 2751, An act concerning crimes and punishment; relating to identity theft; amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 21-4018 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Judiciary.

HB 2752, An act concerning certain pipelines; defining certain crimes relating thereto, by Committee on Judiciary.

HB 2753, An act concerning crimes and punishments; relating to burglary and aggravated burglary; amending K.S.A. 21-3715 and 21-3716 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Judiciary.

REFERENCE OF BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

Speaker Glasscock announced the following bill, appearing on the Calendar as "To Be Referred," was referred to committee as indicated:

Committee on Judiciary: **HB 2742**.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

The Committee on **Higher Education** recommends **HB 2642** be amended on page 2, in line 6, by striking "and the state department of education"; in line 31, by striking "all other" and inserting "federal"; also in line 31, by striking "that specifi-"; in line 32, by striking "ically is used" and inserting "as a result of active national guard membership,"; in line 39, by striking "commitment"; in line 40, by striking "six" and inserting "three"; and the bill be passed as amended.

The Committee on **Insurance** recommends **HB 2247** be passed.

The Committee on **Judiciary** recommends **HB 2629** be amended on page 1, in line 20, after "other" by inserting "security sensitive"; and the bill be passed as amended.

The Committee on **Judiciary** recommends **HB 2630** be amended on page 1, after line 24, by inserting the following:

"Sec. 2. K.S.A. 19-1910 is hereby amended to read as follows: 19-1910. (a) When a prisoner is committed to a county jail in a criminal action, the board of county commissioners shall allow the sheriff reasonable charges for maintaining such prisoner. *All costs incurred by the county jail for medical care and treatment of prisoners held within the county shall be paid from the county general fund when a determination has been made that the prisoner has no other resources. When medical expenses have been paid out of the county general fund of any county in this state for a prisoner held within such county, the county may seek reimbursement of such expenses from the prisoner.*

(b) When a prisoner is delivered to a county jail pursuant to K.S.A. 75-5217 and amendments thereto, the costs of holding such prisoner shall be paid as provided in K.S.A. 19-1930 and amendments thereto."

And by renumbering sections accordingly;

Also on page 1, in line 25, after "K.S.A." by inserting "19-1910 and"; also in line 25, by striking "is" and inserting "are";

In the title, in line 10, after "K.S.A." by inserting "19-1910 and"; also in line 10, by striking "section" and inserting "sections"; and the bill be passed as amended.

On motion of Rep. Weber, the House adjourned pro forma until 9:00 a.m., Friday, February 1, 2002.
