## TWELFTH DAY

SENATE CHAMBER, TOPEKA, KANSAS Wednesday, January 30, 2002—2:30 p.m.

The Senate was called to order by President Dave Kerr.

President Kerr introduced as guest chaplain, Senator Stan Clark, who delivered the invocation:
