HB 2032, An act concerning real property; relating to eminent domain; concerning relocation costs; amending K.S.A. 26-506, 26-508 and 58-3502 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 58-3505, by Committee on Judiciary.

HB 2033, An act concerning civil procedure; relating to protection from abuse and protection from stalking; amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 60-3102 and 60-31a02 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Judiciary.

HB 2034, An act concerning the Kansas power of attorney act; amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 58a-602 and repealing the existing section; also repealing K.S.A. 58-601, 58-602, 58-610, 58-611, 58-612, 58-613, 58-614, 58-615, 58-616 and 58-617, by Committee on Judiciary.

HB 2035. An act concerning children in need of care; relating to the right to counsel; amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 38-1505 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice.

HB 2036. An act amending and supplementing the Kansas consumer protection act; declaring certain representations regarding certain diesel fuel to be a deceptive act or practice; providing penalties and remedies therefor, by Representatives Gatewood and Faber, Barbieri-Lightner, Burgess, Crow, Dahl, Davis, Dillmore, Dreher, Feuerborn, Flaharty, Flora, Gilbert, Gordon, Henry, Horst, Howell, Huebert, Huff, Humerickhouse, Huy, Kas-sebaum, Larkin, Light, Loganbill, P.
