REFERENCE OF BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

The following bills were referred to Committees as indicated:
Ways and Means: **HB 2004, HB 2005.**

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

The following bill was introduced and read by title:

SB 9, An act making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2006, and June 30, 2007, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 2-223, as amended by section 177 of 2005 Senate Bill No. 225, 76-775, as amended by section 181 of 2005 Senate Bill No. 225, 79-3425i, as amended by section

185 of 2005 Senate Bill No. 225, and 82a-953a, as amended by section 88 of 2005 Senate Substitute for House Bill No. 2482, and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Ways and Means.

REPORT ON ENROLLED BILLS

SR 1805, SR 1806 reported correctly enrolled, properly signed and presented to the Secretary of the Senate on June 25, 2005.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Committee on **Ways and Means** recommends **SR 1804** be amended on page 1, in line 12, after "2001" by inserting a comma; in line 13, by striking "as to" and inserting "of"; in line 16, by striking the period; by striking all in line 17; in line 18, by striking all before the semicolon; by striking all in lines 19 through 21; in line 23, by striking all after "approach"; in line 24, by striking all before "and"; in line 25, by striking all after "approach"; by striking all in lines 26 through 29; in line 30, by striking all before the semicolon; in line 31, by striking all after "legislature"; by striking all in lines 32 and 33; in line 34, by striking all before the colon and inserting "receives and considers hundreds of pieces of legislation and studies each year, and it is common practice to accept parts or pieces of a bill or a study while rejecting the rest"; in line 35, by striking "has"; in line 36, by striking "considered" and inserting "does not accept"; also in line 36, after "Myers" by inserting "school funding"; also in line 36, by striking all after "study"; by striking all in lines 37 and 38; in line 39, by striking all before the period and inserting "as the benchmark for funding public education in Kansas"; and the resolution be adopted as amended.
