DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION

(a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the following special revenue fund or funds for the fiscal year or years specified, all moneys now or hereafter lawfully credited to and available in such fund or funds, except that expenditures other than refunds authorized by law shall not exceed the following:

State debt reduction fund

Provided, That all expenditures from the state debt reduction fund during fiscal year 2008 shall be for the purposes of providing funding for retirement or defeasement of pension bonds issued for the Kansas public employees retirement system which bonds become defeasible or callable during fiscal year 2008 or to otherwise offset outstanding state debt to be retired from payments from the state general fund therefor and for which debt service is currently paid from the KPERS bond debt service account of the department of administration: Provided further, That all such expenditures shall be made by the secretary of administration in consultation with the board of trustees of the Kansas public employees retirement system and the Kansas development finance authority and shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on the state debt reduction fund for fiscal year 2008: And provided further, That, except as specifically authorized by this proviso or by other appropriation act of the legislature, no moneys shall be transferred or expended from the state debt reduction fund during fiscal year 2008: And provided further, That, except as specifically authorized by this proviso or by other appropriation act of the legislature, not-

withstanding the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, any other appropriation act of the legislature or any other statute, the state finance council shall have no authority to increase the expenditure limitation on the state debt reduction fund for fiscal year 2008 or to otherwise authorize or provide for any expenditures from the state debt reduction fund for fiscal year 2008.

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009\$0

Provided, That all expenditures from the state debt reduction fund during fiscal year 2009 shall be for the purposes of providing funding for retirement or defeasement of pension bonds issued for the Kansas public employees retirement system which bonds become defeasible or callable during fiscal year 2009 or to otherwise offset outstanding state debt to be retired from payments from the state general fund therefor and for which debt service is currently paid from the KPERS bond debt service account of the department of administration: Provided further, That all such expenditures shall be made by the secretary of administration in consultation with the board of trustees of the Kansas public employees retirement system and the Kansas development finance authority and shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on the state debt reduction fund for fiscal year 2009: And provided further, That, except as specifically authorized by this proviso or by other appropriation act of the legislature, no moneys shall be transferred or expended from the state debt reduction fund during fiscal year 2009: And provided further, That, except as specifically authorized by this proviso or by other appropriation act of the legislature, notwithstanding the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto, any other appropriation act of the legislature or any other statute, the state finance council shall have no authority to increase the expenditure limitation on the state debt reduction fund for fiscal year 2009 or to otherwise authorize or provide for any expenditures from the state debt reduction fund for fiscal year 2009.

(b) On July 1, 2007, and on January 1, 2008, or as soon after each such date as moneys are available therefor, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$40,000,000 from the state general fund to the state debt reduction fund.",

Committee on **Energy and Utilities** recommends **HB 2036** be amended on page 1, in line 26, following "structure" by inserting "which is a single family or multifamily unit of three floors or less"; in line 27, by striking "upon request or" and inserting "prior to the signing of the contract to purchase and"; by striking all in lines 31 through 43;

On page 2, by striking all in lines 1 through 28; preceding line 29, by inserting the new material to read as follows:

KANSAS ENERGY EFFICIENCY DISCLOSURE

As required by KSA 66-1228

Kansas law requires the person building or selling a previously unoccupied new residential structure to disclose to the buyer or prospective buyer, prior to signing the contract for purchase and prior to closing, information regarding the thermal efficiency of the structure (single or multifamily units, three floors or less).

R-value = Thermal Resistance Rating of insulation materials. The higher the Rvalue, the better the material resists heat flow (i.e., the better it insulates).

U-value = **Heat Loss Rating** of windows. The lower the U-value, the less the window loses heat (i.e., the better it prevents heat loss).

Equipment Performance Ratings (the higher the number, the more efficient the equipment)

- AFUE Annual Fuel Utilization Efficiency: used to rate gas or propane warmair furnaces and small boilers.
- SEER = Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio: performance indicator for residential air conditioners and air source heat pumps.
- HSPF = Heating Seasonal Performance Factor: measures heating performance of air- source heat pumps.
- EER = Energy Efficiency Ratio: used to rate window air conditioners and groundloop or ground-water heat pumps in the cooling mode.
- COP = Coefficient of Performance: used to rate ground-loop or ground-water heat pumps in the heating mode.

Energy Star qualified homes are at least 15% more energy efficient than homes built to the 2006 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC). Energy Star is a joint program of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Department of Energy.

The International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), developed by the International Code Council, sets standards for energy efficiency in homes and commercial and industrial buildings. It is revised on a three-year cycle, with a supplement issue midway through each cycle.

The HERS Index is a scoring system established by the Residential Energy Services Network (RESNET) in which a home built to the specifications of the HERS Reference Home (based on the 2006 International Energy Conservation Code) scores a HERS Index of 100, while a net zero energy home scores a HERS Index of 0. The lower the score, the more energy efficient a home is in comparison to the HERS Reference Home. Each 1-point decrease in the HERS Index corresponds to a 1% reduction in energy consumption compared to the HERS Reference Home. Thus a home with a HERS Index of 85 is 15% more energy efficient than the HERS Reference Home and a home with a HERS Index of 80 is 20% more energy efficient.

RESNET Standards ensure that accurate and consistent home energy ratings are performed by accredited home energy rating systems nationwide; increase the credibility of the rating systems with the mortgage finance industry; and promote voluntary participation in an objective, cost- effective, sustainable home energy rating process. This accreditation process will be used by the mortgage industry to accept home energy ratings and by the states to assure accurate, independent information upon which a state may recognize the home energy ratings as a compliance method for state building energy codes; as qualification for energy programs designed to reach specific

energy saving goals; and as a way to provide its housing market the ability to differentiate residences based on their energy efficiency.
