#### CONSENT CALENDAR

Also, on motion of Rep. Moxley to amend H. Sub. for SB 327, the motion did not prevail.

Also, on further motion of Rep. Moxley, H. Sub. for SB 327 be amended on page 5, in line 15, by striking all after "year"; by striking all in lines 16 through 24 and inserting "2012 the average annual operating capacity of renewable electric generation facilities of each electric public utility or electric cooperative utility shall equal not less than 5% of the average annual operating capacity of all electric generation facilities of such utility. By the year 2020 the average annual operating capacity of renewable electric generation facilities of each electric public utility or electric cooperative utility shall equal not less than 10% of the average annual operating capacity of all electric generation facilities of such utility.

(b) As used in this section, "renewable electric generation facilities" means facilities generating electricity utilizing renewable energy resources or technologies, as defined in K.S.A. 79-201, and amendments thereto.":

Also, on motion of Rep. Colloton to amend H. Sub. for SB 327, the motion did not

Also, on motion of Rep. Knox, H. Sub. for SB 327 be amended on page 5, in line 9, after "unit" by inserting "on which construction commenced after January 1, 2008,"; in line 14, by striking "technological practices" and inserting "available control technology"; after line 31 by inserting the following:

"(b) "Best available control technology" means an emissions limitation, including a visible emission standard, based on the maximum degree of reduction for each pollutant subject to regulation under this act which would be emitted from any proposed major stationary source or major modification which the administrator, on a case-by-case basis, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts and other costs, determines is achievable for such source or modification through application of production processes or available methods, systems and techniques, including fuel cleaning or treatment or innovative fuel combustion techniques for control of such pollutant. In no event shall application of best available control technology result in emissions of any pollutant which would exceed the emissions allowed by any applicable standard under 40 C.F.R. parts 60 and 61. If the administrator determines that technological or economic limitations on the application of measurement methodology to a particular emissions unit would make the imposition of an emissions standard infeasible, a design, equipment, work practice, operational standard or combination thereof, may be prescribed instead to satisfy the requirement for the application of best available control technology. Such standard shall, to the degree possible, set forth the emissions reduction achievable by implementation of such design, equipment, work practice or operation, and shall provide for compliance by means which achieve equivalent results.":

And by relettering the remaining subsections accordingly;

Also, on motion of Rep. Flora, **H. Sub. for SB 327** be amended on page 22, after line 28, by inserting:

"New Sec. 34. (a) As used in this section:

- (1) "Affected unit" means any emissions unit which generates electricity in this state and combusts coal in an amount greater than 10% of its total heat input on a rolling 12-month basis and which is a new unit, or is an existing unit that requires a new construction permit pursuant to rules and regulations of the secretary.
- (2) "Inlet conditions" means the concentration of mercury in the flue gas exiting the combustion source prior to application of any air pollution control device.
- (3) "Mercury" means mercury and mercury compounds in either a gaseous or particulate form.
- (b) The secretary of health and environment shall adopt rules and regulations requiring affected units to achieve 80% or greater reduction of mercury from the measured inlet condition of the affected unit.
  - (c) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas air quality act.";

By renumbering remaining sections accordingly;

Also, roll call was demanded on motion of Rep. O'Neal to amend **H. Sub. for SB 327** on page 14, after line 38, by inserting the following:

"(b) It is the policy of this state to prevent the deterioration of air quality in accordance with the following:";

Also on page 14, in line 39, by striking "(b)"; in line 40, after "below," by inserting "promulgate any rule and regulation, or";

On page 15, in line 1, by striking "such act" and inserting "the federal clean air act, as amended"; in line 4 by striking "upon its adoption in accordance with the rules and"; in line 5, by striking "regulations filing act. Nothing" and inserting "after approval by an act of the legislature; provided however, nothing";
