### TWENTY-FIFTH DAY

SENATE CHAMBER, TOPEKA, KANSAS Monday, February 18, 2008—2:30 p.m.

The Senate was called to order by President Stephen Morris. The roll was called with thirty-eight senators present. Senators Emler and Pyle were excused. Invocation by Chaplain Fred S. Hollomon:

## REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Committee on **Commerce** recommends **SB 526** be amended on page 2, in line 32, by striking "may" and inserting "shall"; in line 33, by striking all after "thereto"; in line 34, by striking all preceding the period; also in line 34, following the period, by inserting "Until all PSAP's have achieved phase II status, such moneys shall only be distributed for such purposes to PSAP's that have not achieved phase II status. When all PSAP's have achieved phase II status, then such moneys shall be distributed for such purposes to any PSAP."; and the bill be passed as amended.
