On page 2, in line 4, by striking "care" and inserting "policy"; and the bill be passed as amended.

Committee on **Ways and Means** recommends **HB 2541**, as amended by House Committee of the Whole, be amended by substituting a new bill to be designated as "SENATE Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2541," as follows:

By Committee on Ways and Means

"AN ACT concerning rural housing; creating the housing development grant program; exempting certain cities from certain requirements for rural housing incentive district financing; amending K.S.A. 12-5246 and K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 12-5242, and repealing the existing sections.";
