Senator Sanborn moved that Helen Martin be employed as secretarylo the committee at a salary of \$12.00 per day, pursuant to House Bill No. 1, 1961 Session. Motion was seconded by Senator Warten, and carried unanimously.

The Chairman announced that a joint session of the House and Senate Ways and Means Committees would meet at 9:00 A.M. on Jan. 23, 24, and 25 for the purpose of schooling and information, particularly for the new members of the committees. These meetings to be held in the Ways and Means Committee room of the House of Representatives.
