## EDUCATION COMMITTEE

## Minutes

The tenth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 3:05 P.M., Monday, February 11, 1963 in Room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except Messrs. Dreiling and Teter; Messrs. Gruver, Hughes, McCall and Smith had been previously excused.

Senator Donald Hults appeared before the Committee and reported on Senate Bill No. 13.

Representative Albert F. Glad reported to the members on House Bill No. 67.

Representative Harry C. Minium reported to the members on House Bill No. 120.

SENATE BILL No. 13: Mr. Vogel made the motion, seconded by Mr. Nesmith, that Senate Bill No. 13 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL No. 120: Mr. Lill made the motion, seconded by Mr. Tillotson, that House Bill No. 120 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL NO. 67: Mr. Dixon made the motion, seconded by Mr. Nesmith, that House Bill No. 67 be amended according to the presented draft. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Dixon made the motion, seconded by Mr. Nesmith, that House Bill No. 67 be recommended favorably for passage as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

INTRODUCTION OF COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE BILL: Mr. Harder made

the motion, seconded by Mr. Nesmith, that a bill for compulsory attendance be introduced as a committee bill to be re-referred back to the Committee for consideration. The motion carried unanimously.

There was a short discussion on the past history of the former unification bill. The Chair appointed the following subcommittees to work on the proposed unification bill, in addition to the subcommittee appointed to work on legal questions:

- Requirements for unification -- Messrs. McCall (Chairman),
  Dixon, Edwards, Hughes and Harder.
- Planning Board -- Messrs. Smith (Chairman), Unruh, Teter,
  Finney and Tillotson.
- 3. The role of the State Superintendent -- Messrs. Nesmith (Chairman), West, Gruver, Casado and Lill.
- 4. Time-table and methods of voting -- Messrs. Boyd (Chairman), Vogel, Dreiling, Crow and Robinson.

It was suggested that subcommittees meet upon adjournment of the Committee.

Upon motion of Mr. Harder, seconded by Mr. Nesmith, the meeting adjourned at 3:55 P.M.
