HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Minutes

The twenty-fifth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 3:00 P.M., Tuesday afternoon, March 12, 1963 in Room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except: Messrs. Dreiling and Teter.

Representative Walter Ford appeared before the Committee and distributed copies of an amendment which he wished the members to understand before presenting it on the floor of the House. It was proposed to take care of a unique situation in his district.

Representative George W. Meeker appeared before the Committee to explain House Bill No. 317. He further explained that this bill rendered House Bill No. 60 useless.

After a discussion of these bills, Mr. Tillotson made the motion, seconded by Mr. Casado, that the Committee table House Bill No. 60. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Lill made the motion, seconded by Mr. Finney, that House Bill No. 317 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Harder explained House Bill No. 284. No action was taken on the bill.

Mr. Gruver, Chairman of the subcommittee consisting of Messrs.

Lill, West and himself, reported to the Committee on House Bill No. 393 reading and recommending an amendment to the bill.

Mr. Dixon made the motion, seconded by Mr. Finney, that the

bill be amended as suggested by the subcommittee and recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

The remainder of the meeting was devoted to discussion of House Bill No. 377. It was agreed that the Committee would present three amendments to the bill on the floor of the House the next day.

The motion was made by Mr. Finney, seconded by Mr. Dixon, that the Committee adopt the new wording for Section 22, line 6, page 31 of the bill which would change the word "parents" to "electors." The motion carried unanimously.

The motion was made by Mr. Casado, seconded by Mr. Finney, that the Committee adopt the new wording for Section 18, lines 22 and 23 on election commissioners. The motion carried unanimously.

The motion was made by Mr. Dixon, seconded by Mr. Finney, that the Committee adopt the amendment (Suggested Section C as read by the Chair which changed the 750-student figure to 400 in an area of not less than 200 square miles with an assessed valuation of \$4,000,000.) The motion carried unanimously.

Upon motion of Mr. Unruh, the meeting adjourned at 4:12 P.M.
