Minutes

The twenty-sixth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 4:25 P.M. (upon adjournment of the House), Thursday afternoon, March 14, 1963 in Room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except: Messrs. Dreiling and Teter. Messrs. Boyd, Finney, McCall, Nesmith and Tillotson had been previously excused.

SENATE BILL No. 170:

Mr. Gruver, chairman of the subcommittee consisting of Messrs. West and Lill, reported to the Committee on Senate Bill No. 170 and read an amendment which they suggested.

Mr. Gruver made the motion, seconded by Mr. Vogel, that Senate Bill No. 170 be amended. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Dixon made the motion, seconded by Mr. Vogel, that Senate Bill No. 170 be recommended favorably for passage as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

There was a discussion on House Bill No. 48. No action was taken on the bill.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION No. 22:

Mr. Hughes spoke to the members about this resolution pointing out that it was one of the most important pieces of legislation for them to consider since junior colleges are the most rapidly growing section of public education today.

Mr. Hughes made the motion, seconded by Mr. Harder, that the

Committee recommend Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 22 favorably for passage. The resolution was adopted unanimously.

HOUSE BILL No. 376:

After a discussion of the bill, Mr. Casado made the motion, seconded by Mr. Unruh, that House Bill No. 376 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Unruh requested that the Committee introduce a bill which would provide \$22,000 for students in Haskell County, a common school district, grades one through twelve, which actually closes an academy and takes over the facilities on a rental basis.

The motion was made by Mr. Harder, seconded by Mr. Unruh, that this proposal be introduced as a Committee bill and referred back to the Committee for study. The motion carried unanimously.

It was the decision of the Committee to hold their regular meetings late in the afternoon on days that the House convened at 3:00 P.M.

The meeting adjourned at 4:50 P.M.
