EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Minutes

The twenty-eighth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 3:00 P.M., Tuesday afternoon, March 19, 1963 in Room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except Mr. Dreiling. Mr. Tillotson had been previously excused.

HOUSE BILL No. 271:

Mr. Dixon, sponsor of the bill, explained it to the Committee.

After a discussion of the bill, the motion was made by Mr. McCall, seconded by Mr. Crow, that House Bill No. 271 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried unanimously.

There was a discussion on the possible amendment of this bill so that school districts not in need of emergency school aid would be deleted. The Chair went on record as stating that he felt this was not entirely fair.

Mr. Delbert Mathia of the Kansas County Clerk's Association from Lawrence spoke in favor of House Bill No. 379. Action on the bill was delayed until Senator Porter could speak to the Committee about the bill.

HOUSE BILL No. 243:

Mr. Gruver, Chairman of the subcommittee consisting of Messrs. West and Lill, reported to the members on this bill and read an amendment which they recommended.

The motion was made by Mr. Lill, seconded by Mr. Crow, that the Committee adopt the amendment to House Bill No. 243. The motion carried unanimously.

SENATE BILL No. 230:

Mr. Gruver, Chairman of the subcommittee consisting of Messrs. West and Lill, also reported to the members on Senate Bill No. 230. There was a discussion on Senate Bill No. 183 and House Bill No. 48 also. It was decided to incorporate these bills into Senate Bill No. 230 and Mr. Gruver read the amendment that would accomplish this.

The motion was made by Mr. Hughes, seconded by Mr. Gruver, that the amendment suggested by the subcommittee be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

The motion was made by Mr. West, seconded by Mr. Hughes, that Senate Bill No. 230 be recommended favorably for passage as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL No. 71:

Mr. Lill explained this bill to the Committee.

The motion was made by Mr. Harder, seconded by Mr. Crow, that House Bill No. 71 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion was carried by a show of handswith eight votes for and six against.

After a discussion of Senate reaction to House Bill No. 377, the meeting adjourned at 3:50 P.M.
