## EDUCATION COMMITTEE

## Minutes

The twenty-ninth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 2:45 P.M., Thursday afternoon, March 21, 1963 in room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except Mr. Dreiling. Mr. Tillotson had been previously excused.

Mr. Harder asked that the Committee introduce a bill to allow Washburn University \$3.00 per hour per pupil for undergraduates which would mean an additional aid of \$75,000, approximately. This bill was to be used as insurance should the Senate not take action on the present Washburgn University bill or introduce a like bill.

The motion was made by Mr. Harder, seconded by Mr. Hughes, that the Committee introduce this bill to be referred back to the Committee for further action. The motion carried by a vote of ten for the introduction of the bill and three against.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 379:

Former Senator Porter, attorney for the Topeka Board of Education, Mr. Kerr, Business Manager for the Topeka schools and Mr. James Postma, attorney for the Lawrence Board of Education, were introduced by Mr. Harder. Messrs. Porter and Postma spoke to the members in opposition to House Bill No. 379.

After a discussion of the bill, the motion was made by Mr. Vogel, seconded by Mr. Gruver, that House Bill No. 379 be recommended favorably for passage. The motion was carried with a vote of nine for the bill and four against.
