EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Minutes

The thirty-fifth meeting of the Education Committee convened at 5:00 P.M., April 1, 1963, in Room 522 with Chairman Bower presiding. All the members were present except: Messrs. Dreiling Gruver, McCall, and Teter.

Mr. Harold Deever, Superintendent of Schools of Junction City appeared before the Committee explaining their opposition to one part of the Foundation Program bill which would a hardship on 3a and 3b pupils where there are Federal impact programs. They were not opposing the Program as a whole feeling that a Foundation Program was vitally needed in Kansas.

Mr. Eldon Sloan, Attorney for Clark's School of Business, appeared before the Committee in opposition to Senate Bill No. 435, pointing out that the bill would not be effective against fly-by-night people who swindle students by selling courses to schools that do not exist. Some members felt that if the fee was changed to an annual basis it would be more effective.

SENATE BILL No. 265:

Mr. Finney made the motion, seconded by Mr. Dixon, that Senate Bill No. 265 be recommended favorably for passage as previously amended. The motion carried unanimously.

There was a discussion of Senate Bill No. 425. It was the decision of the Committee to have this bill amended and returned for study.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 P.M.
