House Judiciary Committee Meeting Wednesday, January 9, 1963

The House Judiciary Committee held its first meeting of the 1963 Legislative Session Wednesday, January 9, 1963, in Room 523 with Clyde Hill presiding.

Mr. Hill introduced the members of the committee. He then informed the members that the committee would meet jointly with the Senate Judiciary Committee to discuss a bill which has been studied and prepared by the Judicial Council. He stated that this bill to improve the Code of Civil Procedure has been approved by the Bar Association and the Association is interested in getting the code into better shape. Bulletins containing the entire proposal and the bill, worked out by the drafting department under the supervision of Earl Hatcher, and others, will be available for the observation and study of both the House and Senate Judiciary Committees. When both committees are agreed upon all of it, the bill will be introduced and printed.

Mr. Hill urged all members, who had not previously read the article pertaining to this bill in the Kansas University Law Review, to do so. Copies will be available at the next meeting for those who do not have a copy at their disposal.

The meeting adjourned to meet in joint session with the Senate Judiciary Committee in Room 529 at 2:30 P.M., Tuesday, January 15, 1963. Nineteen members were in attendance. Member Arthur was absent.
