Minutes of the Meeting February 15, 1963

The meeting was called to order at 10:45 a.m., February 15, 1963, by Chairman Lauterbach. All members were present except Senators Smith, Hults, and Farmer.

Mr. Chesley H. Looney, Chairman; Mr. William C. Henry, Director; and Former Chairman Wilbur G. Leonard; of the Board of Probation and Parole, appeared with reference to the Board's budget requests.

- Mr. Leonard made the following comments on the requests:
- Six additional agents and one additional administrator had been requested. The Governor allowed two additional agents; and no administrator.
- In essence, the Governor's other recommendations made no great changes in the requests.
- 3. Without the addition of the six agents as was requested (three to be hired in fiscal year 1964; three in fiscal year 1965); the Board will be limited in operations. It does feel, however, that the two additional positions allowed will accomplish the job presently.
- 4. The Board feels that an additional administrator is vital to the program. The position was allowed at the time the Board was established; but it has never been filled.
 - a. The administrative functions could be assigned to the present parole agents; but the Board has refused to do this. It handles the administrative details.
 - b. Each parole agent has an average caseload of from 65 to 70 parolees.

Senator Glades made a motion that \$7,500 in general revenue funds be incorporated in an appropriation bill for the Kansas National Livestock Association. Senator Sanborn seconded the motion; the motion carried. (See Attachments Nos. 1 and 3.)

Senator Sanborn moved, and it was seconded by Senator Van Sickle, that grants be incorporated in an appropriation bill to the following agencies and in the following amounts: (all from the general revenue fund)

Veterans of Foreign Wars 3,600
Veterans of World War I 2,000

The motion carried. (See Attachments Nos. 2 and 3.)

Senator Sanborn moved that an appropriation bill be introduced in the Senate incorporating the grants to the Kansas National Livestock Association, American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, United Spanish War Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and Veterans of World War I. Senator Glades seconded the motion; motion carried. (See Attachment No. 3.)

SENATE BILL No. 218

By Committee on Ways and Means

AN ACT making appropriations for the fiscal year 1964 for grants to the American Legion, department of Kansas; to the disabled American veterans, department of Kansas; to the united Spanish war veterans, department of Kansas; to the veterans of foreign wars, department of Kansas; to the veterans of world war I, department of Kansas; to the academy of science; to school district No. 75, Lansing, Kansas; and to the Kansas national livestock association.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the state 2 general revenue fund of the state of Kansas for the fiscal year 3 ending June 30, 1964, the sums as set forth in section 2 to section 4 9, both inclusive, of this act for grants to the state agency named 5 in each section.
