### SENATE BILL No. 431

By Committee on Ways and Means

AN ACT making appropriations for the fiscal year 1964 for the operation, maintenance, support and functioning of the commission on civil rights, nuclear energy advisory council, Kansas judges retirement board, state board of education (vocational), state school retirement board, state department of public instruction (including state superintendent of public instruction), state treasurer-school fund commission, and the state brand commissioner; authorizing the fixing of salaries, restricting the expenditure of certain funds and authorizing appeals connected therewith; reappropriating unencumbered balances as of June 30, 1963, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

### PART I—STATE GENERAL REVENUE FUND APPROPRIATIONS

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the state 2 general revenue fund of the state of Kansas for the fiscal year 3 ending June 30, 1964, the sums as set forth in section 2 to sec-4 tion 6, both inclusive, of this act, for the operation, maintenance, 5 support and functioning of the following officers, employees, 6 departments, boards, commissions, institutions, agencies and 7 other activities of the state government of the state of Kansas. SEC. 7. There is hereby reappropriated out of the following 2 special revenue funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964, 3 all moneys now on deposit with the state treasurer to the credit 4 of, or as may hereafter be collected by, or for, to each of the 5 following state agencies or activities of the state as set forth 6 in section 8 to section 15, both inclusive, of this act, as now 7 provided by law or as may hereafter be provided by law, to the 8 extent actually collected and available to be used as provided 9 by law, but not to exceed the amounts set forth in such sections.

PART III—MISCELLANEOUS	
Sec. 16. Revolving funds. Moneys in all "revolving	funds"

Sec. 16. Revolving funds. Moneys in all "revolving funds" 2 of the state agencies named in this act are hereby reappropriated 3 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964.

SEC. 17. Federal grants. All federal grants and other fed-2 eral receipts are hereby appropriated for the purpose set forth 3 in such federal grant or receipts to the agency of the state 4 receiving the same for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964.

Sec. 18. Fixing of salaries. Except as may be otherwise 2 fixed under the state civil service act or other applicable laws, 3 salaries and wages shall be fixed on an annual basis prior to 4 the beginning of each fiscal year by any state board for em-5 ployees of institutions under its control, and by elected officials, 6 department heads or commissions for their authorized employ-7 ees. When salaries or wages have been so fixed the controller 8 of the state department of administration shall be advised in 9 writing and he shall be guided by such advice in passing pay-10 rolls for payment. Changes in such salaries made during the 11 fiscal year shall be reported to the state controller, in writing, 12 for his guidance. Except as otherwise provided by law, each 13 employee of the state shall be paid for the proportion of his 14 annual salary earned each month as of the end of such month 15 and as soon as is practicable after the end of each month.

SEC. 19. Cash basis. In all cases in which appropriations 2 are made by the provisions of this act, the officer or person 3 having charge of such appropriations shall, in no case, by any 4 contract, act or proceeding attempt to obligate the state of 5 Kansas at any time to pay larger sum or sums than that herein 6 specifically appropriated, and no larger sum or sums shall be 7 audited by the controller of the state department of adminis-8 tration for the purposes herein mentioned than are herein 9 appropriated, and in no case shall any appropriation herein 10 provided be used for any purpose or purposes except that spe-11 cifically stated herein; and no officer or employee of the state

12 shall purchase any article or service on the state's credit unless 13 specific appropriation has been made therefor.

SEC. 20. Approval of expenditures. The controller of the 2 state department of administration is hereby authorized to draw 3 his warrant on the state treasurer upon the presentation of 4 payrolls or vouchers duly itemized and approved in the name 5 of the chief executive officer of the state agency to which appro-6 priations are by this act made available.

SEC. 21. Effective date. This act shall take effect and be in 2 force from and after July 1, 1963, and its publication in the 3 statute book.
