## STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE February 23, 1965

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, who immediately appointed a sub-committee composed of Mr. Doyen, Mr. Ford and Mr.  $F_r$ ibley to study H.B. 720 and come up with some recommendation.

- H.B. 570 came before the Committee for discussion and Mr. Harlow Brown moved that the bill be moved out without recommendation. The motion was seconded by Mr. Griffith and upon vote, the motion was declared lost with only 4 yes votes. Thereupon, Mr. Doyen moved that the bill be reported adversely. Upon second by Mr. Meckel the committee voted with a majority of 9 yes votes to do so.
- H.B. 607 was then considered. There was considerable discussion concerning this; and it was then moved by Mr. Doyen that the time in line 10 be amended to fifteen minutes instead of ten. Motion was seconded by Miss Jacquart and carried unanimously. It was moved by Mr. Ford and seconded by Mr. Fribley that H.B. 607 be recommended favorably, as amended. Motion carried unanimously.
- H.B. 547 came up for discussion and Mr. Light presented a proposed amendment concerning educational requirements, and stated that the Board favors the amendment. There was discussion concerning the possibility of rebating to the students in the Barber Colleges, a portion of their earnings; and further discussion that if the time in school is increased that the apprenticeship should be shortened until it will still take only 2 years to become a licensed barber.

The Chairman asked all members to have their amendments prepared and that they would be discussed and voted upon rather soon.

Meeting was adjourned.
