The meeting was called to order and Mr. Teter was introduced to discuss H.B. 1078. He stated the proposal deals with electrical contractors and the hazards involved in working with electricity; that inspectors such as fire inspectors who make inspections in buildings are not really informed and are not adequate to make these inspections. He states that this bill would insure that no apprentice would do work without the direct supervision of a journeyman electrician and that it would create better standards in wiring and promote safety.

The Chairman stated that S.B. 196 was a bill that was being run through on the municipal bond refund and that it takes in Hutchinson and Salina. Mr. Light stated that he had an amendment that would take in all first and second class cities and moved that same be adopted. Mr. Buchele seconded the motion and Mr. Stutz stated that if this amendment is adopted that he won't bother with his. Upon vote, motion lost 6 yes to 8 no. Thereupon Mr. Buchele moved that Mr. Stutz' suggestion be adopted, which would take in Atchison. Motion was seconded by Mr. Jelinek and carried 10 to 4. Mr. Fribley then moved that the bill as amended, be recommended favorably. Motion carried without opposition.
