SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Minutes of the Meeting March 3, 1965

The meeting was called to order at 10:15 a.m., March 3, 1965, by Chairman Sanborn. All members were present except Senators Ward and Saar.

Mr. James Bibb, State Budget Director, appeared before the Committee and gave a detailed report on a proposal to lease-purchase an executive-type aircraft for use of State officials. He stated that the proposal has been included by reference in the Governor's budget recommendations, in which the Governor asked favorable consideration of the proposal. A bill which encompasses the recommendations contained in the above report was presented by the Chairman for Committee consideration. Thereupon, Senator Woodard made a motion that the bill be introduced as a Committee bill with the recommendation that it be referred back to the Committee for further consideration. Senator Van Sickle seconded the motion. The motion carried. Senator Warren voted no, and asked that his vote be so recorded. (See copy of bill attached.)

The Chairman appointed Senators Van Sickle, Bell and Liebert to act as a subcommittee to study the above referenced bill and make their recommendations.

Senator Van Sickle discussed the subcommittee's report on the STATE HISTORICAL SOCIETY. During his presentation, Senator Bowers raised a question concerning the razing of the caretaker's house at the John Brown Historical Park. In order to determine the answer to the question, Senator Van Sickle requested time to contact the agency.

Senator Arthur presented the subcommittee's report on the STATE LIVESTOCK BRAND COMMISSION, in which the subcommittee concurs with the Governor's budget recommendations. He moved that the subcommittee report be adopted and its provisions included in an appropriation bill to be introduced by the Committee. Senator Bell seconded the motion. The motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was adjourned at 10:55 a.m.
