to hear from Johnson County.

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CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: That will be after lunch,

BE IT REMEMBERED that on the 18th day of February, 1966, the House Committee on Legislative Apportionment again met for public hearing; whereupon the following proceedings were had.

CHAIRMAN MEEK: We will come to order. I know that we all want to get home and this is going to be a brief meeting. So without further ado, you know the purpose of this meeting is to present the Johnson County maps. I will call on Mr. Ken Howard to present the map that he is interested in.

MR. HOWARD: Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee, I have here on the board one copy and another copy here of the map that was just completed last night by the delegation, and it corresponds with these figures. The district numbers aren't on this map but the population is. We go from a population of

17,900 and some to a population of 19,400, approximately 1,400 from the top to the bottom. As you realize, I wouldn't say particularly this is a map that I would absolutely agree to or that any of the delegation would absolutely agree to, because, of course, I would have more than likely presented eleven, but the committee has decided and we on that decision present this map to you as the map that probably would work in with what plan the Committee of the Whole is working on at the present time.

As you see, our county average being 18,600 and some—to start with we are about six per cent over the state average, so as it works out our top district would be about ten per cent over the state average. But, of course, that is only four per cent from our median. We do have, as you can see from the figures, a lot of large districts. We have tried to keep in connection the city boundaries as well as to make compact districts.

CHAIRMAN MEEK: Mr. Howard, are these two maps identical?

MR. HOWARD: Yes, the two are identical. This one is colored and this one has also the figures on it.
