STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE April 13, 1967

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman with all members present except representatives Unruh, Andrews, Boyer, Jelinek, McCray, McGill, Turner and Woodworth.

The Chairman stated that he knew of no reason why the committee should meet in the interim; that the research department is working on the unclaimed property compact so there is no need for the committee to do any work; that he was releasing the sub-committees previously appointed; that the private club matter had been fully discussed in committee and that individuals differed on their beliefs and that they could prepare their bills and offer them next year if they wished. He further stated that the Senate was sending over a bill into which they had amended SB 387 which State Affairs had killed and that so far as he was concerned it could lay over in committee.

Mr. Taylor then called for action on SB 229 which deals with sewer districts and providing for a levy to finance them. Mr. Rogers moved that it be recommended favorably and Mr. Buchele seconded the motion. Mr. Bunten inquired if that affected Topeka, and Mr. Buchele replied that it is a general bill. Then Mr. Buchele stated that it was rural because it mentions county commissioners.

The question was called for and the motion carried unanimously.

The Chairman stated that it was possible that we might find it necessary to call other brief meetings before the session ended, but that he would make the announcements. He then thanked the members for their cooperation this year and wished them good luck.

The meeting was adjourned.
