## Special Joint Committee on Legislative Facilities April 11, 1967

All members but Representative Turner were present.

Representatives from the IBM Company demonstrated the "Selectric" model typewriter for the Committee.

The Committee examined proposals submitted by vendors of five major distributors and manufactures of electrical type-writers. After reviewing them, Senator Bennett and Representative Doyen moved that the Committee purchase 80 "Remington 25" electric typewriters per the proposal dated March 27, 1967. (A copy of the proposal is in the Committee file in the Research Department). Motion carried.

The Committee selected a large type for the type face for the machines.

The Research Department was directed to work with representatives of the Remington distributor for receiving, storing, and in installing the machines.

In considering what should be done with the manual type-writers, the Committee decided that twenty of the manual type-writers will be retained by the legislature and the remainder should be declared surplus and offered to the Boys and Girls Industrial Schools, the Industrial Farm for Women, and the State Penitentiary and Reformatory. It was agreed to submit a report

to both Houses recommending that the Speaker and President Pro
Tem take the necessary steps to declare the machines surplus and
arrange their transfer.

The meeting was adjourned.
