## STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE January 10, 1968

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, with all members present except Mr. Woodworth and Mr. Fribley, both of whom were excused.

The Chairman discussed HB 1654, explaining that it was a local bill that affected only his home county and Wallace County, and there was no objection to the bill by Wallace County; that it would simply permit rents and income from the county home to be kept in a separate fund to be used for repairs, expansion, etc. and to be kept apart from the general funds of the county.

Mr. Ford moved that the bill be reported favorably. Upon second by Mr. Turner the motion carried unanimously.

The Chairman called attention to the fact that there are twenty-four bills on the books; that some are obsolete and should be killed and others perhaps that should have consideration. He urged that the members look them over and be prepared to take action very soon.

The Chairman stated that the Chief Clerk had requested that HR 1025 be acted upon and gotten off the books as there would soon be another 1025. Mr. Turner moved that the resolution be reported adversely. Mr. Rogers seconded the motion and it carried without dissent.

Mr. Doyen discussed the matter of the cemetery proposal again, and presented a proposed bill, asking that it be introduced as a Committee bill and then after printing referred back to the committee for study. Motion was seconded by Mr. Rogers. Mr. Bunten expressed the opinion that some of these bills should be introduced by individuals because it gives the conotation of committee approval. There was some agreement with this opinion but upon vote, the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Jelinek advised the Chairman that Mr. Linde would like to be heard on HB 1309.

The meeting was adjourned.
