STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE February 13, 1968

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman. The first order of business was HB 1921. Messrs. Davis, Van Cleave and Williamson discussed the various aspects of this bill. The bill will be taken under consideration by the committee.

Mr. Loux was called upon to discuss House Bill 1965. The bill would make the distinction between Class A and Class B clubs and would be a source of revenue for the State and local units of government. The bill will be taken under consideration by the Committee.

The next order of business was HB 1909. Mr. McGill was called upon to discuss this bill. Mr. McGill made a motion that the bill be recommended for passage. The motion was seconded by Mr. Turner and the vote carried unanimously.

HB 1883, "Name Tag Bill", was the next bill before the committee. Mr. Jelinek moved that the amendment to HB 1883 be adopted and the motion was seconded by Mr. McGill. The vote was unanimous. Mr. Turner made a motion that HB 1883 be recommended for passage as amended. Mr. Kessinger seconded the motion. The vote carried unanimously.

Chairman Taylor discussed HB 1837. Mr. Fribley made a motion that amendments to this bill be adopted. Mr. Andrews seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously. Mr. Fribley moved that HB 1837 be passed as amended with recommendation that it be passed. Motion was seconded by Mr. Kessinger and the vote carried 12 to 1.

Mr. Buchele was called upon to discuss HB 1888. This bill would reduce the distance of a liquor store from a church from 200' to 100'. A motion was made by Mr. Rogers that HB 1888 be recommended favorably. Motion was seconded by Mr. Andrews and lost 5 to 6. Mr. Andrews moved that HB 1888 be reported adversely. The motion was seconded by Mr. Buchle. Motion carried.

Mr. Andrews made a motion that HB 1921 be reported favorably. Mr. Fribley seconded the motion. The motion carried favorably.

Mr. Turner moved that HB 1965 be reported favorably. Mr. McCray seconded the motion. The motion was defeated 2 to 9. Mr. McGill made a motion that HB 1965 be reported adversely. Mr. Fribley seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mr. Rogers made a motion that a bill concerning members of the Hotel, Motel and Restaurant Association be re-introduced to the Legislature and referred back to the State Affairs Committee for consideration.
