Dear Mr. Barrett:

Based on the State of Kansas having existing roll call and sound system in House Chamber removed by July 1, 1968, WE PROPOSE:

- 1. To install latest model of the Thompson-International in the Kansas House Chamber ON RENTAL, completing installation on or before December 31, 1968, for the sum of \$17,500.00, covered by Performance Bond. Said sum shall be paid in partial payments as work progresses, and shall entitle the State to use the equipment until June 30, 1969 with all supplies and maintenance furnished free.
- 2. To supply State with Altec Sound System consisting of
 - 1, #352A 5-Channel Mixer/Power Amplifier, plus
 - 4, Floor Microphones,
 - 2, Loudspeakers, which shall become outright property of State of Kansas.
- 3. To Rent and Maintain said Thompson-International Roll-Call System in House, for as long as the parties hereto agree, at the standard price all other States pay with similar machines, of \$7,500.00 per annum, which covers all supplies and services in accord with Schedule A, hereto attached; with first payment due on or before December 31, 1969, for the fiscal year starting July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1970.
- 4. To guarantee to the State of Kansas non-removal of Rental Roll Call equipment for 5 Years, and no price increase for 3 Years.

I. PROVIDES STATE WITH A MODERN DEPENDABLE ROLL-CALL SYSTEM.

II. PRIOR TO EACH SESSION:

- A. Furnish and install new names for Indicator Boards in alphabetical order and set up Switchboard;
- B. Furnish and install new Roll-Call sheets:
- C. Clean and check Roll-Call System, making any repairs necessary;
- D. Give instructions to new Clerks as to operation of Roll-Call System.

III. DURING EACH SESSION (No Local Attendant Required):

A. Factory-trained technicians available 24 hrs. a day 7 days a week.

1. International Systems almost never stop working. Any mishaps corrected by factory-trained technicians within 24 hrs.

B. 24 hr. printing service is available on Roll-Call sheets.

Company possesses its own continuous form printers.
 a. Company maintains a printing drum for each State.

2. Company prints additional Roll-Call sheets within 24 hrs.

3. State has no loss due to purchasing large quantities of Roll-Call sheets that have to be discarded if Member resigns and new Member replaces him.

4. When a new Member is elected, we provide at no extra cost:

a. Roll-Call sheets with name of new Member within 48 hrs.

 New Roll-Call sheets are inserted into the System by a Company technician;

c. New Indicator Board cards (furnished by Company) are inserted in proper alphabetical order by our technicians;

d. Roll-Call System is given a preventive maintenance check.

IV. BETWEEN SESSIONS:

A. Recording and counting units are returned to factory to be checked out, cleaned, and any new improvements added - so as to maintain a modern up-to-date Roll-Call System that will not become obsolete.

V. SPECIAL SESSIONS:

A. Prior to Special Session:

1. We supply new Roll-Call sheet marked "SPECIAL SESSION";

2. Have factory-trained technician fly to State and:

a. Install new Roll-Call sheets furnished by Company;

b. Rearrange Indicator Boards and seating arrangement;

c. Give Roll-Call System complete check-out.

VI. ENGINEERING SERVICE:

A. Roll-Call engineers always available for consultation on any changes the State might require at a later date.

AGREEMENT TO CARRY OUT HOUSE BILL NO. 55 OF THE

1955 SESSION OF THE KANSAS

LEGISLATURE

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 28th day of June, 1955 by and between the Communication Equipment and Engineering Corporation of 5646 West Race Street, Chicago, Illinois, hereafter referred to and designated as party of the first part, and the State of Kansas, by and through its Executive Council created pursuant to G. S. 1949, 75-2101, and authorized by House Bill No. 55 of the 1955 Session of the Kansas Legislature to enter into this agreement, hereinafter referred to and designated as party of the second part.

WITNESSETH, the party of the first part hereby agrees to furnish and install the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System and appurtenances in the Chamber of the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas, consisting of the Selector-Recorder, Main Terminal Board, Generator for D/C current, a Master copy design for use in having the roll call sheets printed, with appurtenances as specified below, all completely installed for operation, subject to the approval and acceptance of the Executive Council of the State of Kansas. The appurtenances hereinabove referred to, to be installed with the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System, are as follows:

- 1. One (1) Cee-Co 3-Division Electric Roll Call machine, with capacity up to 140 members, consisting of Selector-Recorder, Terminal Board, Generator, and line-plate wired and installed ready for operation in the manner above provided and on the date hereinafter set forth. The Selector-Recorder to be installed shall be constructed in such a manner so as to be operated by automatic continuous feed of the roll call sheets.
- 2. Two (2) Cee-Co Wall Indicator Boards which shall list the membership of the House of Representatives in alphabetical order, with illuminated bulls'-eyes to the right of the names in three colors, and shall designate the voting choice of each member by color, i.e., Green for Yes, Red for No, White for Present. The Indicator Boards shall be mounted and installed on the walls of the House of Representatives to the front of the Chamber in locations to be designated and selected by the architect of the State of Kansas.
 - 3. Two (2) Cee-Co Wall Voting Register and Totalizers shall be installed on the walls of the House of Representatives to the front of the Chamber in locations to be selected by the architect of the State of Kansas and shall indicate by abbreviation and numerals the legislative subject and its number prior to the taking of the vote of the members of the House of Representatives. After the voting is completed, the totals of the three voting divisions on each wall indicator board, i.e., Yes, No, and Present, shall automatically be indicated by figures which shall be lighted and large enough in size to be seen throughout the Chamber of the House of Representatives. In addition, the Wall Vote Register and Totalizers shall be constructed so as to provide a continuous type totalizer showing continuous totals of the vote of members of the House of Representatives at intervals from six to twelve seconds between the time the voting is announced and voting is closed.

- 4. One (1) Cee-Co Miniature Indicator Board shall be installed similarly to the Wall Indicator Boards, except the names of the membership shall be indicated thereon by the pattern of the seating arrangement of the House of Representatives so as to enable the Speaker to identify the members more easily. This indicator board shall also include the automatic counters, enabling the presiding officer to note the result of the votes on all legislative subjects.
- 5. One Hundred Twenty Six (126) Cee-Co Voting Stations shall be installed which shall be completely enclosed, and mounted flush with each desk or place of voting in the Chamber of the House of Representatives. They shall be so constructed as to be instantly removable and replaceable in the event a voting station becomes inoperable. In addition to the 126 voting stations required for service, five (5) additional voting stations will be supplied as spares for use in the event others so installed become defective.
- 6. One (1) Page Call System and Page Boards shall be constructed and installed. The Page Boards shall consist of bronze plates with illuminating discs, numbered the same as the desks of the House of Representatives, and placed in the same pattern as the desk floor plan. They shall be made in two sections so that one half will be served from one side of the chamber and the other half from the other side of the chamber. The two Page Boards shall be mounted and installed on the walls of the House of Representatives to the front of the chamber in locations to be designated and selected by the architect of the State of Kansas.
- 7. Four (4) Warning Signal Bells or Chimes will be installed in locations to be designated and selected by the state architect, and the switch to operate the same shall be installed on or near the speaker's desk for his use in conducting the proceedings of the House of Representatives.

The foregoing appurtenances include the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call items on which the maintenance service is included under the lease-rental provisions of this contract, as well as the option to purchase provision hereinafter set forth.

The party of the first part further agrees to install for operations in the House of Representatives, in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by the architect of the State of Kansas, and subject to the approval and acceptance of the Executive Council, Cee-Co Sound and Communication Equipment, which shall consist of the following items:

l. One (1) custom built sound system installed for manual operation, complete excepting microphones. Electrical conduits shall be installed as a part of said sound system, which will enable the installation of individual desk microphones and associated equipment if at a later date the Legislature of the State of Kansas shall authorize the purchase and installation of such microphones and associated equipment. Said sound system shall provide for connecting microphones located throughout the Chamber to amplifiers, and transmitted through special type loud speakers. A switchboard shall be installed to be similar in operation to telephone switchboards with six phone-type block connections, allowing up to six microphones in the circuit at any one time. Volume control switches shall be installed on the switchboard to enable the sound operator to properly adjust and control the volume thereof. In the event that it is necessary to procure said custom built sound system, electrical conduits and associated equipment, pursuant to the

provisions of G. S. 1953 Supp. 75-3739, relating to competitive bids, the party of the first part hereby agrees to submit a bid for the installation of such electrical conduits and sound system without additional consideration or cost to the State of Kansas, other than as hereinafter provided, and agrees to supply and install said electrical conduits and sound system as provided in this section of this agreement, and to complete the installation thereof at the same time said Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System is installed in the Chamber of the House of Representatives. The provision of this agreement with respect to the installation and performance bond hereinafter referred to shall cover the provisions of this particular section of the agreement relating to the installation of said electrical conduits and said sound system. The party of the first part agrees to cooperate with the architect of the State of Kansas in carrying out the plans and specifications for remodeling and raising the floor of the House of Representatives pursuant to House Bill No. 55, and to install, during the course of such work, all necessary electrical conduits for the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System and the Cee-Co Sound and Communication Equipment, as provided herein. In the event this agreement is terminated for any reason and in the manner hereinafter provided, it is agreed between the parties hereto that all electrical conduits installed for said Roll Call System and said Sound and Communication Equipment shall be and remain the property of the State of Kansas.

- 2. One (1) Stand Deluxe Radio Receiver for receiving standard broadcasts, and arranged so that members may listen to a broadcast through the Chamber sound system or confine radio reception to the receiver speaker itself.
- 3. One (1) Tape Recorder shall be furnished and mounted so that the sound operator may record any discussions which may occur upon the floor of the House of Representatives, upon directions to do so from the presiding officer.
- 4. To insure continuous operation of the custom built sound system, one (1) standby amplified shall be installed so that the sound operator may instantly switch to the standby amplifier in the event of a failure of the main amplifier to operate. In addition, special type speakers shall be mounted in suitable locations to be selected and designated by the architect of the State of Kansas to provide for undistorted and balanced sound distribution throughout the Chamber of the House of Representatives.
- 5. One (1) Electric Timer shall be installed which will provide accurate timing of the period allowed a member of the House of Representatives to speak on any legislative subject. At the completion of the time period allowed by the rules, a red warning light will flash, observable by the member speaking, as well as by the presiding officer and the entire membership, signifying completion of the member's allotted time to speak.
- 6. Automatic dial telephones shall be installed to provide for immediate private conversations between the speaker's desk, speaker's office, clerk's desk, clerk's office, majority floor leader's desk, minority floor leader's desk, and the Senate Clerk's desk. The telephones so installed shall be located as selected by the architect of the State of Kansas.

The warranty covering the items indicated above to be installed as a part of the Cee-Co Sound and Communication

Equipment includes the standard manufacturer's warranty and does not come under the annual maintenance responsibility of the party of the first part as hereinafter provided.

The party of the first part agrees to complete the installation of the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System and appurtenances as hereinbefore described, together with said Cee-Co Sound and Communication equipment, in accordance with plans and specifications of the architect of the State of Kansas, and have the same in full and complete operation by the 1st day of January, 1956, subject to the acceptance thereof by the Executive Council. The completion date for the installation of said equipment is conditioned upon the completion of the remodeling of the floor plan of the House of Representatives and the installation of new desks on or before November 1, 1955.

The party of the first part agrees to furnish an installation and performance surety bond in an amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), conditioned upon the installation of the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System and the Cee-Co Sound and Communication Equipment in the Chamber of the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas as set forth herein, and to save harmless the State of Kansas from any loss, expense or damage for any reason with respect to the installation of said Roll Call System and said Sound and Communication Equipment which may be incurred as a result of any suits which may be filed against the party of the first part or the members of the Executive Council and to pay all costs, expense and attorneys' fees which may be incurred in the enforcement of this contract or the defense of any litigation or in the enforcement of the conditions and obligations of said surety bond, said surety to be authorized to do business in the State of Kansas as provided by law.

In consideration of the installation of the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System, its appurtenances and the Cee-Co Sound and Communication Equipment hereinbefore described, the party of the second part hereby agrees to accept said equipment, as hereinbefore provided, on a lease-rental basis for a minimum of five years rental from January 1, 1956, and for such additional time in the future as the party of the second part may elect to continue the use and operation of said Roll Call System, and said Sound and Communication Equipment unless and until the party of the second part exercises the option to purchase outright said equipment as hereinafter provided. The party of the second part hereby agrees to pay as rental for said Roll Call Equipment, its appurtenances and said Sound and Communication Equipment, upon the approval and acceptance of the same by the Executive Council, the sum of Seventeen Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$17,600.00) for the year of 1956, payable as follows:

Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) upon delivery of said Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System and its appurtenances to the State capitol building, together with said Sound and Communication Equipment; an additional Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) when conduits and main terminal board wiring is completed, and the balance of said sum when said Roll Call System and said Sound and Communication Equipment is fully installed and operating and has been accepted by the Executive Council.

The party of the second part further agrees to pay as rental for said Cee-Co Roll Call System and said Sound and Communication Equipment for the year of 1957 the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), payable January 1, 1957.

The party of the second part further agrees to pay as rental for the use of said Cee-Co Roll Call System, its appurtenances, and said Sound and Communication Equipment, the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) per year, payable January 1, 1958, and each year thereafter as long as the rental provisions of this contract remain in force and effect.

It is hereby agreed that all interest and title to all of the Cee-Co Roll Call System, its appurtenances, and said Sound and Communication Equipment herein described, shall remain vested in the party of the first part unless and until the option to purchase said equipment is exercised by the party of the second part as hereinafter provided.

The party of the first part hereby expressly agrees to properly maintain the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System and its appurtenances during the entire period of the leaserental terms of this agreement by having its service representative call prior to the opening of each session of the Legislature to check and adjust said Roll Call System, as well as to make such repairs as may be deemed necessary for dependable operation of the system. It is expressly understood that all maintenance service shall be without cost to the party of the second part except any damage which may be incurred by accident, carelessness or sabotage, and the party of the first part further agrees that it will provide for immediate attention locally for adjustment and repair to said Roll Call System and its appurtenances in the event of a failure of its operation and will restore service thereof immediately.

The party of the first part further agrees that in the event the party of the second part elects to install individual desk microphones throughout the House of Representatives, in addition to the microphones and sound equipment hereinbefore described, the party of the first part will supply and install up to seventy-five (75) microphones and attach the same to the sound system in the House of Representatives, for the sum of Twenty-Four Hundred Dollars (\$2400.00), and an annual rental therefor in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per year after the first year said microphones have been installed, payable January 1 of each year said equipment is rented; provided, however, that the provisions of House Bill No. 55 and G. S. 1953 Supp. 75-3739, shall be complied with in the event said equipment is acquired for rental purposes or is purchased outright by the party of the second part.

The party of the first part hereby agrees to sell at any time to the party of the second part during the lease-rental period of this contract the entire Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System, its appurtenances, and said Sound and Communication Equipment, for the sum of Eighty-Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$89,500.00). In the event the option to purchase said equipment is exercised by the party of the second part, it is understood and agreed that all moneys which shall be paid to the party of the first part in the form of rental for such system, its appurtenances, and said Sound and Communication Equipment, will be fully credited against the above purchase price.

The party of the first part further agrees that in the event the party of the second part elects to exercise the option to purchase said Roll Call System, its appurtenances, and said Sound and Cummunication Equipment, including individual desk microphones, if the same have been installed, within five years from January 1, 1956, to provide maintenance service for said system in the same form and manner as that to be provided on a rental basis, for the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per year for a period not exceeding five years from the date of purchase by the party of the second part. In the event, however, the option to purchase said system and said equipment is exercised by the party of the second part after more than five years of rental, the annual service and maintenance charge shall be negotiated to the mutual satisfaction of the parties to this agreement.

This contract may be terminated by either party after the same shall have been in effect on a lease-rental basis for five (5) years from January 1, 1956, by giving notice in writing six months prior to the termination date to be fixed in said notice as follows: The notice to be given the party of the first part by the party of the second part shall be in the form of a joint resolution adopted by the House of Representatives and the Senate of the State of Kansas, which shall fix the date of termination therein and shall be transmitted to the President of the party of the first part by registered mail; the notice to be given the party of the second part by the party of the first part shall fix the date of termination therein and shall be served upon the Governor and the Secretary of State of the State of Kansas.

In the event this agreement is terminated by the party of the second part after the Cee-Co Electric Roll Call System, its appurtenances, and the Cee-Co Sound and Communication Equipment have been installed in the Chamber of the House of Representatives, the party of the first part hereby agrees to cause said system and said equipment to be immediately removed from the Chamber of the House of Representatives in accordance with plans and under the direction of the architect of the State of Kansas; said system and said equipment shall be removed with the least damage possible to the walls of and fixtures in the Chamber of the House of Representatives, and any unreasonable injury, loss or damage to the Chamber of the House of Representatives or to the flooring, fixtures or furniture therein, shall be assumed and paid for by the party of the first part. All electrical conduits shall be and remain the property of the State of Kansas, as hereinbefore provided.

It is agreed between the parties hereto that should the party of the first part fail, neglect or refuse to complete the installation of said Cee-Co Roll Call System, its appurtenances and said Cee-Co Sound and Communication Equipment for any reason on or before the time heretofore agreed upon, excepting on account of an act of God; the stoppage or impairing of materials, supplies or equipment necessary for the full performance of this contract as a result of the need therefor for national defense purposes; or the seizure or the taking over of the manufacturing plant or facilities of the party of the first part by the United States government for national defense purposes, or by reason of any strike or cessation of work by the painters, carpenters or electrical workers in Topeka, Kansas, the party of the first part shall forfeit and immediately pay to the party of the second part the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), as provided in the surety bond attached hereto, for each day from and after January 1, 1956 that this contract is not fully performed and the work and equipment herein provided for accepted by the Executive Council.

| NOW, THEREFORE, if the above named principal shall in all respects well and truly perform and discharge all of the obligations covenants, conditions and guarantees placed upon it in said contract at the time and in the manner required by said contract, and shall install said Cee-Co equipment in strict compliance with the terms, conditions and obligations of said contract, and shall save harmless the said State of Kansas from any loss or damage arising from any action by said principal, or its agents, servants or employees, in the performance of said work, or in any manner connected therewith, and shall promptly pay its said agents, servants and employees, and all persons furnishing labor, material, equipment or supplies in the course of the performance of said work, and shall promptly pay all damages, penalties, and interest thereon, when and as the same may be lawfully due the State of Kansas, by reason of and directly connected with the performance of such contract, or any part thereof, and shall, carry out to the letter and to the satisfaction of the State of Kansas architect, all, each and every one of the conditions, obligations, stipulations, covenants, agreements and terms of said contract, and all of the expense, and cost, and attorney's fees that may be incurred in the enforcement of said contract, or in the enforcement of the conditions and obligations of this bond, or in the defense of any litigation which may involve either or both parties to said contract, then this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise, to remain in full force and effect. AGREEMENT

| This Agreement made this day of |

| 1968, by and between COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT AND ENGINEERING |
| COMPANY, an Illinois corporation, hereinafter referred to as |
| 'party of the first part," and the STATE OF KANSAS, here- |
| inafter referred to as "party of the second part," |

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties on June 28, 1955, entered into an agreement for the installation and use of a CEE-CO electric roll call system and appurtenances in the Chamber of the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas, and

WHEREAS, the party of the first part installed such roll call system in accordance with said agreement and the system has been in continuous operation and use by the party of the second part as provided in said agreement, and

WHEREAS, the party of the first part, pursuant to the terms of said agreement, has elected to cancel the agreement at the end of the 1968 session of the House of Representatives and the parties desire to enter into a new agreement for the 1969 session,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties here-inafter contained, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The party of the first part agrees that the party of the second part shall have the right to use the CEE-CO roll call system and its appurtenances for the calendar year 1969, and the party of the second part agrees to pay for the use of said CEE-CO roll call system and its appurtenances for the calendar year 1969 the sum of \$3,500.00 payable January 1, 1969.
- 2. The party of the first part agrees to maintain the roll call system and its appurtenances during the calendar year 1969 and to make necessary repairs for dependable operation of the system without cost to the party of the second part except with respect to any maintenance, damage or repairs which may be caused by accident, carelessness or sabotage or acts of the party of the second part or its agents.
- 3. It is understood that the title and interest in the roll call system and its appurtenances shall remain vested in the party of the first part.
- 4. The parties agree that within _____ days after December 31, 1969, the party of the first part shall remove the system and appurtenances from the Chamber of the House of Representatives with the least damage possible to the walls and fixtures in the Chamber of the House of Representatives and that such removal shall be under the direction of the

architect of the State of Kansas. All electrical conduits shall remain the property of the State of Kansas.

5. The parties further agree that the agreement entered into on June 28, 1955, is terminated and cancelled and that the provisions of said contract do not apply to this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Agreement is signed by the Vice-President and Treasurer of the party of the first part and its corporate seal affixed, and by the duly authorized Representatives of the State of Kansas pursuant to authority of the 1968 Kansas Legislature.
