Gentlemen:

May I first extend my thanks for the time spent by your Committee with Mr. Gullick and myself. It was a pleasure meeting with you. Unfortunately I did not have the full background and history of your installation at the time we were together so I am afraid that I half way made promises that we could not go through with.

Since getting back to Chicago we have discussed your problem at some length and have come up with the following conclusions:

- First The original contract of June 25, 1955 cannot be reinstated because CEECO, since they cancelled it last October after your letter, have made other legal commitments.
- Second The original installation bond only covered installation and was cancelled after the system was accepted by you. No bond covering the performance on a leased or rented system can be gotten from an insurance company without incurring at least a cost of \$500.00 per year which would have to be passed on to you.

Therefore, we suggest that you get approval to purchase your present system at the agreed cost of \$89,500.00, less the \$61,000.00 paid through 1968 or \$28,400.00 plus \$2,800.00 for the modification of the Bill/Totals Display Board or a total of \$31,200.00. We do not think that you need a maintenance contract. With the air fare being \$58.80 round trip to Chicago plus \$100.00 a day labor it would be much cheaper to have any repairs done on a daily basis. Also to fix and raise the existing voting stations would have to be done on a time and material basis and we can only guesstimate that it would probably be in the neighborhood of \$15.00 per station.

If you do not wish to purchase your present equipment then the yearly rental, without any credit towards purchase but including modification of the Bill/Totals Display, will be \$4,200.00 per year including maintenance.

If you desire to trade in your present recorder and voting stations for new models this will add \$45,000.00 to your cost without installation which will have to be done by a local Kansas electrical contractor.

The work we propose to do on your Bill/Totals Display Board is to change the Bill Number Display to one alpha and 4 numerical matrixes with amber lights; the Yes totals change the lenses to green and the No totals change the lenses to red.

We trust this quotation will warrent your consideration and that we may be favored with your valued order.
