## MINUTES

## LEGISLATIVE SERVICES AND FACILITIES

The Joint Committee on Legislative Services and Facilities met in the Senate Ways and Means Room at 2:00 p. m. on January 13, 1970, for the purpose of approving personnel and the pay scale for the 1970 session.

All members, with the exception of Senator Harder, were present. In addition to the Committee, Bill Bachman, Secretary to the Joint Committee, was in attendance.

Chairman Doyen called the meeting to order.

Representative Loux moved to continue the salary of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per day for the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives. The motion was seconded by Senator Warren, and carried unanimously.

Representative Ossmann moved to authorize personnel that is shared by the House and Senate at the same rate as the previous session. The motion was seconded by Representative Loux and carried unanimously.

The Chairman authorized Bill Bachman to investigate committee room assignments from last session, and to make recommendations on how they can be better utilized by the committees.

After some discussion, Chairman Doyen posed the question of hiring certain Senate personnel to Senator Smith, who stated that the same staff was hired for this session as was employed last year.

Bill Bachman announced the pay days this session would be February 2, February 16, March 2, and March 13.

Except as otherwise noted, the individual remarks recorded herein have not been transcribed verbatim and this record has not been approved by the committee or by the individuals making such remarks.

Chairman Doyen announced that Senator Ball's wife would like employment with the Legislature. It was the feeling of the Committee that a place should be found for her.

The meeting was adjourned.
