Mrs. Harriett Graham and Mrs. Winkler appeared before the Committee on House Bill No. 1466. Mrs. Graham and Mrs. Winkler presented the position of various Women's organizations including the Association of University Women, National Association of Business and Professional Women and the women of the AFL-CIO. All remarks centered around the deletion of "sex" in the bill. The position of the women is that it should be included and that women holding the same positions as held by men should receive equal pay and benefits. No action was taken on the bill.

John Corkhill explain Senate Bills No. 394, 395 and 396, to the Committee. Action on the bills was as follows:


S.B. 394 - on a motion by Sen. West, seconded by Sen. Thomas, it was voted to recommend the bill favorable for passage to the full Senate.
