ROADS AND HIGHWAYS COMMITTEE MEETING -- FEBRUARY 4, 1971

The Roads and Highways Committee met in room 529 at 2:45 P. M. on February 4, 1971. Chairman Dierdorff called the meeting to order and all members were present except Dugan and Nowlin.

Mr. John Bower, Representative of District 41 was the conferee.

HOUSE BILL 1096 - AN ACT designating highway K-32 as the kaw valley scenic highway; requiring appropriate marking thereof by the state highway commission.

Mr. Bower distributed sheet (Exhibit 1, attached) showing points of interest along Highway 32. He read the following from the fiscal note: "The Highway Commission reports that it estimates the initial sign installation on the Kaw Valley scenic highway would be \$789 and annual maintenance would amount to \$175 in future years. The cost of the installation of \$789 in FY 1972 budget could be absorbed within the current budget limitations. The annual maintenance of \$175 would appear in FY 1973 and later budgets under the maintenance activity."

Mr. Ratner made a motion, second by Mr. Rosenau, that "kaw valley" in the bill be capitalized. Motion carried. Mr. Hayes made a motion, second by Mr. Wingert, that House Bill 1096 be reported favorably as amended. Motion carried. (2 No votes)

Mr. Dugan was absent so the sub-committee report on House Bill 1044 was postponed until Monday, February 8, 1972.

Mr. Arbuthnot and Mr. Wingert reported that they had been contacted by their engineers with the request to raise the limit from 120 thousand dollars. The Chairman asked them to check with the sub-committee working on the bill.

Mr. Ratner read the attached letter from the State Highway Commission explaining that House Bill 2111 from the 1968 Session, which was intended to make some clarifying amendments to the statutes relating to highway contracts and bonds was passed in the House but on about the last day of the Senate it was passed with a floor amendment, indicated in ink on line 30 of page 2, to correct an erroneous statutory reference which both the Revisor and Staff Attorney of the Highway Department missed." Mr. Ratner asked permission of the committee to have a bill drawn up and brought back as a committee bill. Mr. Ratner made a motion, second by Mr. Jacobs, that this be brought back as a committee bill. Motion carried.

Mr. Dierdorff asked permission of the committee to introduce a highway bill as a committee bill (Exhibit 3, attached). explained that he had been working with the Senate to try to work out a bill but they could not agree.

Mr. Ratner made a motion, second by Mr. Wingert, that the bill be introduced as a committee bill. Motion carried. (Lady voted no.)

The meeting was adjourned.

Obviously we have managed to get along without this for two years, but we continue to have some problems of interpretation which we think would be largely eliminated by this bill. I would appreciate it if your committee would consider introducing the bill; and of course I would be glad to discuss it with you or the full committee at any time.

HOUSE BILL No. 2111

By Committee on Roads and Highways

AN ACT concerning contracts of the state highway commission; third party claims in certain cases; amending K. S. A. 68-410 and 68-411 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K. S. A. 68-410 is hereby amended to read as follows: 1 68-410. All contracts for the construction, improvement, recon-2 struction, and maintenance of the highway system, the cost of which exceeds one thousand dollars (\$1,000), except contracts between 4 the state highway commission and the various counties, shall be 5 awarded at a public letting to the lowest responsible bidder: Pro-6 vided, however, That no contract for a single project or structure shall be divided into two or more contracts and awarded without 8 public letting and to other than the lowest responsible bidder. The 9 state highway commission shall make necessary rules and regula-10 tions covering the making and receiving of bids and letting of con-11 tracts: Provided, That no contract shall be awarded to a non-12 resident individual, partnership or corporation unless the same has 13 established a permanent office in the state of Kansas so that service 14 can be had and taxes collected from said nonresident: And pro-15 vided further, That the provisions of section K. S. A. 16-113 of the 16 Revised Statutes of 1923 shall not apply to contracts made by 17 the state highway commission. The person or persons to whom a 18 contract may be awarded shall give good and sufficient surety bond 19 by a company authorized to do business in this state to be approved 20 by the state highway commission, and filed with said commission 21 in such sum as the state highway commission shall fix, not less than 22

1	the amount of such contract price, conditioned that such contractor
2	will faithfully perform such contract in every respect and condi-
3	tioned further that such contractor or contractors or subcontractor
4	or subcontractors of said contractor or contractors shall pay all
5	indebtedness incurred for supplies, materials or labor furnished

4	or contractors to pay for or make settlement for the items covered
5	by this act: Provided further, That any person to whom there is
6	due any sum for labor or material or for any item covered by this
7	act or his assigns, may bring an action on said bond for the recovery
8	of said indebtedness and said suit may be brought in any county
9	in the state where any part of said contract has been performed
0.	Provided further, That no such action shall be brought on said bond
1	unless within six (6) months after the completion date of said con
2	tract, which shall be the date of the state highway commission's fina
3	acceptance of the work done under such contract, according to the
4	records of the state highway commission, there be filed with th
5	state highway commission an itemized statement of the amount of
6	such indebtedness, which itemized statement must be sworn to an
27	acknowledged before a notary public or other officer authorized t
28	administer oaths: Provided, That no action shall be brought of
29	said bond after one (1) year from the completion date of said con
30	tract: Provided further, The provisions of section K. S. A. 60-14-1
31	of the Revised Statutes Supplement of 1933 and section

60-1414 of the Revised Statutes of 1923 shall not apply to contracts made by the state highway commission. 2 Sec. 2. K. S. A. 68-411 is hereby amended to read as follows 3 68-411. The state highway commission shall make partial paymen to a contractor performing any road or bridge work under contrac with it, as the work may progress, said partial payment not to be less than ninety percent (90%) of the contract price of the materia delivered and work done and accepted. The highway commission shall provide by regulation, to be made a part of all specifications 9 for the withholding of not more than ten percent (10%) of the ful 10 contract price of any such work until the work is satisfactorily com pleted and approved by the state highway commission and th 12 provisions of the contract and bond therefor have been fully satis 13 fied; but the highway commission shall not be required to withhol 14 any sum on account of any claim of a third party after action upo 15 the bond by such claimant is barred under the provisions of K. S. A 16 68-410, as amended, unless such withholding is directed by a court of 17 competent jurisdiction. 18 19

Sec. 3. K. S. A. 68-410 and 68-411 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after 20 its publication in the statute book. 21
