The Committee on Rules and Journal met at 11:30 a.m., January 14, 1971, in Room 530.

The following were present:

Representative Nothern, Chairman, presiding Representative Bower, Vice-Chairman Representative Love, Member Representative Gaines, Member Representative Tobias, Member

Also present were:

Representative Harper Representative Howard Fred J. Carman, Revisor of Statutes.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Mr. Carman passed out copies of Resolution relative to the Rules of the House of Representatives for 1971-1972 sessions, amending Rules 3 and 22 and providing for a Consent Calendar.

Discussed by members and comments made.

Chairman Nothern called on Representative Harper for his comments and suggestions. He commented on Consent Calendar and also about time to object to bills placed on Consent Calendar.

The question of time was discussed and motion made by Representative Bower, to make time two full legislative days instead of one day. Seconded by Representative Gaines. The motion carried.

The Chairman asked Mr. Carman to prepare copies of above
Resolution ready for presentation on floor of the House Monday
morning to give opportunity to all members to make recommendations.
The Committee will act on it at a laternmeeting.

Further suggestions and comments by Representative Harper:

- 1. Representative Harper thought the rule requiring 2/3 vote to override committee recommendations and to move a bill up on the Calendar should be changed to a simple majority.
- 2. He asked for consideration of having a "call of the House" when we are in committee as a whole. Reason advanced was the committee as a whole has the power to kill a bill or substantially amend it. That is where the real changes are made and the fate of the bill determined, rather than on third reading. As a result people should be compelled to register their vote as an alternative. He proposed we absolve the committee and simply conduct all business formally before the House.

One reason advanced by others present why a call of the House should not be authorized during the committee as a whole is that none of the floor amendments are in writing and members cannot see them or have an opportunity to really know what they are voting on. Also, the bill may get so altered by amendments that it is difficult for members to understand the exact nature of what they are voting on and they need time for reflection before being compelled to make a recording vote.

3. Representative Harper recommended a rule be passed that relatives of members of the Legislature be not employed.

It was felt by most members of the committee that proper jurisdiction of this question rested with the Committee on Legislative Services and Facilities.

The Chairman then called on Representative Howard for his recommendations and comments on Rules of the House. He suggested that some time in the future we should consider having a committee on committees, as the Senate does.

Mr. Carman will prepare amendments to House Resolution No. 1009 for distribution at the next meeting.

The Chairman stated that the next meeting of the Committee will be on Monday, January 18, 1971, immediately after adjournment of the House. There will also be another meeting in the afternoon of the same day.
