Chairman Gabriel asked if House Bill 1922 would increase the cost of bank examiners from the State Banking Department. Mr. Stones said that this Department is a fee agency and that House Bill 1922 could be under some burden but not an insurmountable burden; that additional examiners will be needed for investigating of branches.

Mr. William Mitchell representing the Kansas Association for Economic Growth, an association of 75 Kansas banks for the multi-bank holdings concept. This association supports House Bill 1922 as a compromise bill with Kansas Bankers Association. Mr. Mitchell stated that House Bill 1922 does not go far enough. He then urged the Committee to make a study of multi-bank holding concept and that the Committee adopt such a resolution.
