MINUTES

Joint Committee on Legislative Services and Facilities

May 10, 1972

The Joint Committee on Legislative Services and Facilities met in Room 527-S of the Statehouse on Wednesday, May 10, 1972, at 10:00 a.m. Chairman Ross Doyen presided, and Representatives Ossmann, Andrews and Senator Warren were present. Staff present were Mr. William R. Bachman, Secretary; Dr. J.W. Drury and Mr. Richard Ryan, Research Department; and Mr. Fred Carman, Revisor of Statutes' office. Mr. Bob Hougland of the State Architect's office was a guest of the committee.

Space Assignments

Mr. Hougland reviewed proposals made to the committee on April 21, 1972 and passed out copies of new proposals which he had prepared in accordance with committee instructions at the April meeting. Speaking to the new proposals Mr. Hougland cited considerations in addition to the previous committee instructions, i.e. because of expansion of activities the State Library, the Secretary of State, the Budget Division and the Governor's office all needed some additional space. Mr. Hougland had prepared alternate proposals, each designed to solve the above problems to varying degrees.

Discussion centered mainly around the necessity for any of the Accounts and Reports Division (Department of Administration) to remain in the Capitol building. Representative Andrews moved that the committee recommend design D (page 8 of handout) for first floor assignments and that design B,C,D (page 6 of handout) be modified to assign the two offices on either side of the stairway in the north side of the east wing to the legislature and be further modified to assign only the two south offices on the west side of the south wing to the Lieutenant Governor with the third room being assigned to the legislature as a conference room, and that design B,C,D be recommended for second floor assignments. Further, that space assignments to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor be considered permanent and the other assignments temporary. Senator Warren seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

It was mentioned that after the Legislative Coordinating Council has approved the recommendations the committee should then consider actual usage of the space which will be available

to the legislature. This might include trading with other agencies to make more efficient use of space. Specifically mentioned was that if the press, judicial council and commissioner of the supreme court could be relocated from the fifth floor to some of the other available space, the fifth floor could then be used entirely by the legislature.

Mr. Houghand told the committee that except for receiving bids and letting contracts nothing could start until after July 24 when the Insurance Commissioner is scheduled to move out of the Capitol building.

Secretary's Report

Mr. Bachman reported that the Senate lounge proposals from the different decorators had not been received yet.

The committee agreed that the chairs in the House of Representatives which are in good condition would not be reupholstered at this time.

Mr. Bachman showed the committee a new design for page buttons. Representative Andrews moved that the legislature buy the new style buttons. Representative Ossmann seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Senator Doyen mentioned that Mr. Bachman had received a request from a legislator to reproduce and mail to each member of the legislature a statement of his intentions not to seek reelection. The committee agreed this was not a function of the Legislative Services office.

The committee instructed Mr. Bachman to look into transferring the function of issuing parking permits to legislators from the Secretary of State's office to the Legislative Services office. Mr. Carman was instructed to give assistance in legislating this change.

Enrolled Resolutions

Representative Andrews mentioned that resolutions memorializing Congress from the State of Kansas did not identify the state on the resolution clearly. Mr. Carman mentioned that they have the seal of the Secretary of State at the bottom. Representative Andrews moved that the staff bring to the attention of the proper committee the fact that the enrolled resolutions memorializing Congress should identify the State of Kansas more clearly. Representative Ossmann seconded the motion, and the motion passed.


