The conferees appearing before the Committee were:

Chairman Hoagland brought the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. and the minutes of the February 1, 1979 meeting were approved.

Rep. Douville, Chairman of the Civil Law Sub-Committee, reported the sub-committee's recommendations on HB 2058. They recommended minor amendments on Page 2, Line 73, Line 75, Line 77 and striking all of lines 78 and 79, and part of line 80. Rep. Douville moved the committee approve the designated cleanup amendments to be done by the Revisor's office. Seconded by Rep. Frey. Motion Carried. Rep. Ferguson then moved HB 2058 be passed favorably as amended. Seconded by Rep. Glover. Motion Passed.

The committee had a brief discussion on HB 2105, but no motions were made on the bill.

Rep. Glover gave the Family Law Sub-Committee report on HB 2010 and HB 2012, in the absence of the sub-committee chairman. They recommended to the committee two small amendments. Rep. Brewster moved the committee adopt the first amendment on Page 3, Line 118. Seconded by Rep. Matlack. Motion Carried, for adopting amendment of HB 2010. Rep. Glover moved to adopt the second amendment for HB 2010 on Page 4, Line 119. Seconded by Rep. Brewster. Motion Carried. Rep. Glover moved to pass HB 2010 favorably as amended. Seconded by Rep. Matlack. Motion Passed.

Rep. Glover reported the sub-committee recommended some cleanup language on HB 2012. Rep. Glover then put this amendment in the form of a motion. Seconded by Roth. Rep. Heinemann then offered a substitute amendment on Line 223, "that any such placement so ordered could only last 15 days after which time the Secretary would have to take custody of the child. Seconded by Rep. Roth. After some discussion Rep. Heinemann withdrew his motion and Rep. Roth withdrew his second. The cleanup amendment motion was then made by Rep. Glover and seconded by Rep. Gillmore. Motion carried. Rep. Roth then moved to strike the date "January 1" and insert the date "July 1" to HB 2012. Seconded by Rep. Gillmore. Motion Passed.

Unless specifically noted, the individual remarks recorded herein have not been transcribed verbatim. Individual remarks as reported herein have not been submitted to the individuals appearing before the committee for editing or corrections.
