Senate Bill No. 441 - Siting of electric transmission lines. Senator Simpson explained the bill, which would make changes in eminent domain procedures. Committee discussion with him followed.

Wayne Zimmerman introduced Drue Jennings, assistant general counsel for the Kansas City Power and Light Company, who spoke in opposition to the bill. He objected to economic pressure outdarate levels and procedural problems which he thought the bill/occasion. Committee discussion with him followed.

Glenn Cogswell, representing the Cities Service Gas Company, suggested that the legislation is far too sweeping to be taking up this late in the session. He stated it would place an extremely large burden to the condemning authority; it would cause extra expenses and increase costs of eminent domain. Committee discussion with him followed. During committee discussion, it was pointed out that this bill is identical to a bill that was handled last year, and passed both the House and the Senate but died in conference committee.

Senate Bill No. 442 - Violation of traffic law, giving of appearance bond or deposit of driver's license. Col. Rush testified in support of the bill. He stated he considers this good legislation because certain courts in the state are requiring traffic officers to take bond in every case. Committee discussion with him followed. During committee discussion, Col. Rush pointed

out that there was a practical problem of the present procedure taking an undue amount of time for troopers.

Senate Bill No. 440 - County payments to state to assist in paying district court personnel costs. Richard Schultz, the court administrator for the Third Judicial District, testified in support of the bill with suggested amendments. Committee discussion with him followed.

senate Bill No. 373 - State juvenile facilities, crimes relating to escapes. Dr. Harder introduced Charles Hamm who spoke in support of the bill, pointing out it is merely a cleanup.

Senate Bill No. 378 - Reimbursement by parents of juvenile code commitment costs. Mr. Hamm testified in support of the bill. Committee discussion with him followed.

The meeting adjourned.
