House Bill No. 2174 - Homestead exemption relating to house trailers. Representative Gillmore, the author of the bill, testified in support of it. Committee discussion with him followed. During the discussion, staff was requested to report back to the committee as to the effect of the homestead exemption.

Tom Morris testified in support of the bill; a copy of his statement is attached.

Following further committee discussion, Senator Berman moved to amend the bill to add a new section so that the homestead provision of the probate code would be consistent with this bill. Senator Hein seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

House Bill No. 2177 - Appraisements of real estate prior to sale or lease by a representative at private sale.

Representative Gillmore explained the bill. He said K.S.A. 59-2307 requires appraisal of real estate by court approved appraisers prior to its sale or lease at private sale by a representative of an estate.

<u>House Bill No. 2612 - Fee for resignation of resident agents.</u> Representative Gillmore explained the bill.

These minutes were read and approved by the committee on 4-25-79.


