Rep. Waggener

Chairman Beezley called the meeting to order. He explained that HB 2584, a Ways and Means Committee bill, had been assigned to the Agriculture and Livestock Committee and could be acted upon. This act concerns the state board of agriculture; relating to certain fees and taxes. Chairman Beezley asked for a motion on this bill. Rep. Smith moved that HB 2584 be passed out of committee favorably. Rep. Fuller gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

SB 298 - Agriculture land, relating to the acquisition and use thereof. Subcommittee Chairman Rep. Waggener thanked the subcommittee members, Representatives Hinshaw, Hagerman, Knopp and Schmidt for their time and input. He also thanked Raney Gilliland, Research for his work on the bill. Rep. Waggener went through the definitions section and the restrictions section of the bill. (See Attachment I). The entire hour was taken up by the presentation and questions asked by committee members. Rep. Bussman moved to hold the bill in committee for interim study. Rep. Hagerman gave a second to the motion. Vice Chairperson Aylward made a substitute motion to pass the bill out favorably as amended. Rep. Apt gave a second to the motion. On a show of hands, the motion lost. Rep. Polson made a substitute motion to recess until noon. Rep. Fuller gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

The minutes were approved and the meeting adjourned until noon.

Vice Chairperson Aylward called the meeting to order. Rep. Bussman moved that the bill be held in committee for an interim study and also the reporting bill, SB 396. Rep. Hamm gave a second to the motion.

Rep. Leach made a substitute motion to amend line 68 to read, after the amendment; "if such stockholder has an ownership interest in the majority of the voting stock as provided for in provision (1). Rep. Knopp gave a second to the motion. After discussion, the amendment was adopted.

Rep. Knopp moved to adopt the amendments proposed by the subcommittee. Rep. Apt gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

Rep. Crowell moved to amend line 39 to add, "not to exceed 5,000 acres."

Rep. Leach gave a second to the motion. The motion lost.

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AGRICULTURE AND LIVESTOCK

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Rep. Crowell moved to amend the grandfather clause conceptually by stating that everyone be in compliance within a ten year period. Rep. Hagerman gave a second to the motion. The motion failed.

Rep. Hinshaw moved that SB 298 by passed favorably as amended. Rep. Apt gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

Vice Chairperson Aylward said that the Speaker had given the Committee permission to meet tomorrow if needed.

AN ACT concerning agricultural land; relating to the acquisition and use thereof; repealing K.S.A. 17-5901.

0020 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

0021 Section 1. As used in this act:

0022 (a) "Corporation" means a domestic or foreign corporation
0023 and includes a nonprofit corporation.

- 0024 (b) "Nonprofit corporation" means a corporation organized 0025 not for profit and which qualifies under title 26, section 501, "c" 0026 3 of the United States code.
- (c) "Limited corporate partnership" means a limited partnership, as defined in K.S.A. 56-122, which has as a member or members, whether as general or limited partners, one or more corporations.
- (d) "Corporate partnership" means a partnership, as defined in K.S.A. 56-306, which has within the association one or more corporations.
- (e) "Feedlot" means a lot, yard, corral, or other area in which livestock fed for slaughter are confined. The term includes within its meaning agricultural land which is used for the raising of erops or other vegetation and land upon which livestock fed for slaughter are allowed to graze or feed in such acreage as is reasonably necessary for the operation of the feedlot.
- 0040 (f) "Agricultural land" means land suitable for use in farm-
- (g) "Farming" means the cultivation of land for the production of agricultural crops, the raising of poultry, the production of eggs, the production of milk, the production of fruit or other horticultural crops, the production of seed, including grass seed,

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grazing or the production of livestock. Farming does not include the production of timber, forest products, nursery products, or sod, and farming does not include a contract where a processor or distributor of farm products or supplies provides spraying, harvesting or other farm services.

- (h) "Fiduciary capacity" means an undertaking to act as executor, administrator, personal representative, guardian, conservator or freeeiver or trustee in bankruptcy.
- (i) "Family farm corporation" means a corporation:
- (1) Founded for the purpose of farming and the ownership of agricultural land in which the majority of the voting stock is held by and the majority of the stockholders are persons related to each other as epouse, parent, grandparent, lineal ascendents of grandparents or their epouses and other lineal descendents of the grandparents or their, all of whom have a common ancestor within the third degree of relationship, by blood or by adoption, or the spouses of any such persons, or persons acting in a fiduciary capacity for persons so related;
- (2) all of its stockholders are natural persons or persons acting in a fiduciary capacity for the benefit of natural persons; and
- (3) at least one of the stockholders is a person residing on the farm or actively engaged in the day to day labor or management of the farming operation. If only one stockholder is meeting the requirement of this provision and such stockholder dies, the requirement of this provision does not apply for the period of time that the stockholder's estate is being administered in any district court in Kansas.
- (j) "Authorized farm corporation" means a corporation other than a family farm corporation founded for the purpose of farming and the ownership of agricultural land in which:
- (1) The Subject to provision (4), the stockholders do not exceed five 15 in number;
- (2) the stockholders are all natural persons or persons acting in a fiduciary capacity for the benefit of natural persons or nonprofit corporations; and
- (3) at least a majority of the stockholders are persons residing on the farm or actively engaged in the day to day labor or man-

 - (4) If one of the beneficiaries dies, and more than one person succeeds, by bequest, to the deceased beneficiary's interest in the trust, all of such persons, collectively, shall be deemed to be one beneficiary. A husband and wife, and their estates, collectively, shall be deemed to be one beneficiary.
 - (n) "Testamentary trust" means a trust created by devising or bequeathing property in trust in a will as such terms are used in the Kansas probate code.
- Sec. 2. (a) No corporation, trust, limited corporate partnership or corporate partnership, other than a family farm corporation, authorized farm corporation, family trust, authorized trust or testamentary trust shall, either directly or indirectly, acquire or otherwise obtain or lease any agricultural land in this state. The restrictions provided in this section do not apply to the following:
 - (1) A bona fide encumbrance taken for purposes of security.
 - (2) Agricultural land when acquired as a gift, either by grant or devise, by an a bona fide educational, religious or charitable nonprofit corporation.
 - (3) Agricultural land acquired by a corporation for immediate or planned use in nonfarming purposes in such acreage as is reasonably necessary for the operation of a nonfarming business. Such land may not be used for farming except under lease to one or more natural persons, a family farm corporation, authorized farm corporation, family trust, authorized trust or testamentary trust. The corporation shall not engage, either directly or indirectly, in the farming operation and shall not receive any direct financial benefit, other than rent, from the farming operation.
 - (4) Agricultural land acquired by a corporation by process of law in the collection of debts, or pursuant to a contract for deed executed prior to February 17, 1081 the effective date of this act, or by any procedure for the enforcement of a lien or claim thereon, whether created by mortgage or otherwise.
 - (5) A municipal corporation.
 - (6) Agricultural land which is acquired by a trust company or bank in a fiduciary capacity or as a trustee for a family trust,

The attorney general or district or county attorney shall institute suits on behalf of the state to 0187 prevent and restrain violations enforce the provisions of this section. 0189 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 17-5901 is hereby repealed. 0190 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its publication in the statute book.

Strike and add: (7) A corporation, corporate partnership, limited corporate partnership, or trust owning or leasing agricultural land on the effective date of this act, provided such entity shall not own or lease any greater acreage of agricultural land than it owned or leased on the effective date of this act unless such entity qualifies under the provisions of this act.

Strike.

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(10) Agricultural land used to conduct scientific or experimental farms.

(11) Agricultural land used for the growing of crops for seed pur-

poses or for the growing of alfalfa.

(12) Agricultural land owned or leased by a corporate partnership or limited corporate partnership in which the persons associated therein are qualified, under this act, to engage in farming operations.

(13) Any corporation, either domestic or foreign, organized for coal mining purposes which engages in farming on any tract of land owned by it which has been strip mined for coal.

(c) Civil penalties sued for and recovered by the attorney general shall be paid into the state general fund. Civil penalties sued for and recovered by the county attorney or district attorney shall be paid into the general fund of the county where the proceedings were instigated.
