Bill Duitsman, Secretary of Agriculture Guy Gibson, Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources

Senator Kerr called the meeting to order. He briefed the committee on future meetings this week and mentioned it was his intention to not introduce any legislation until sometime after February 6 when the farm corporate case will be heard.

Bill Duitsman, Secretary of Agriculture, was introduced and presented background information on his department.

Senator Norvell questioned whether it will be possible to operate the Agriculture Department on the budget of \$5.6 million which is in the general appropriations for next year. Mr. Duitsman indicated they have two items that they need to increase. They have pruned 11 positions but do need some increases in the meat and poultry and milk inspection divisions.

In answer to Senator Warren's inquiry relating to scale testing, Mr. Duitsman said that needs to be relocated with better facilities available in order to meet specific requirements.

Mr. Gibson presented a quick overview of his current activities as Chief Engineer stating they were accountable for 26 laws including channel changes, water rights, bank lines, watershed districts, ground water and irrigation districts; and are involved in four water compacts with Colorado, Oklahoma and Nebraska. They operate under the Water Appropriations Act of 1945. Vested rights for water and the domestic right regarding water come under their jurisdiction.

Senator Kerr stated opponents and proponents of the Executive Reorganization Order No. 18 are being heard by the Energy and Natural Resources Committee but he felt members of the Agriculture Committee should have some background relative to this Order before it comes before the Senate. If the Order is not rejected within 60 days it then becomes a law. Mr. Duitsman and Mr. Gibson, in answer to an inquiry, stated if the Order became law it would abolish the Water Resources Division of the State Board of Agriculture and there would not be a chief engineer position; all authority would go to the director of such water resources authority as proposed by the Governor.

Senator Gannon moved, and Senator Karr seconded, that the minutes of the January 22, 1981, meeting be approved as written.

Meeting adjourned.

Executive Reorganization Order No. 18

(REPRINT)

By Governor John Carlin

Transmitted January 13, 1981

Section 1. In order to consolidate and coordinate the administration, planning and regulation of the state's water resources, there is hereby established within the executive branch of government the Kansas water resources authority, which shall be administered under the direction and supervision of a director of water resources who shall be appointed by the governor, with the consent of the senate, and who shall serve at the pleasure of the governor. The director of water resources shall be in the unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act and shall receive an annual salary to be fixed by the governor. The Kansas water resources authority shall be the sole state agency concerned with future public water supply planning, development, administration and regulation.

Sec. 2. There is hereby established within and as a part of the Kansas water resources authority a division of water resource planning, the head of which shall be the deputy director for water resource planning. Under the supervision of the director of water resources, the deputy director shall administer the division of water resource planning. The deputy director for water resource planning shall be appointed by the director of water resources and shall be in the classified service under the Kansas civil service act.

Sec. 3. (a) On July 1, 1981, the state water resources board created by K.S.A. 74-2605, and the office of executive director of the state water resources board created by K.S.A. 74-2607, are hereby abolished.

(b) All of the powers, duties and functions of the existing state water resources board and the existing executive director of the

state water resources board are hereby transferred to and conferred and imposed upon, respectively, the Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order.

- (c) The Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order shall be the successor in every way, respectively, to the powers, duties and functions of the state water resources board and the executive director of the state water resources board in which the same were vested prior to the effective date of this order. Every act performed in the exercise of such powers, duties and functions by or under the authority of the Kansas water resources authority or director of water resources established by this order, respectively, shall be deemed to have the same force and effect as if performed by the state water resources board or the executive director of the state water resources board, respectively, in which such powers, duties and functions were vested prior to the effective date of this order.
- (d) Whenever the state water resources board, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the Kansas water resources authority established by this order.
- (e) Whenever the executive director of the state water resources board, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, such reference shall be deemed to apply to the director of water resources established by this order.
- or the executive director of the state water resources board or the executive director of the state water resources board in existence on the effective date of this order shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be duly adopted rules and regulations of the director of water resources established by this order until revised, amended, revoked or nullified pursuant to law. The director of water resources may adopt rules and regulations governing the administration of the division of water resource planning.
 - (g) All orders and directives of the state water resources board

- or the executive director of the state water resources board in existence on the effective date of this order shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be orders and directives of the Kansas water resources authority and director of water resources established by this order, respectively, until revised, amended or nullified pursuant to law.
 - (h) On the effective date of this order, the director of water resources shall succeed to whatever right, title or interest the state water resources board has acquired in any real property in this state, and said director shall hold the same for and in the name of the state of Kansas. On and after the effective date of this order, whenever any statute, contract, deed or other document concerns the power or authority of the state water resources board to acquire, hold or dispose of real property or any interest therein, the director of water resources shall succeed to such power or authority.
 - (i) The Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order, respectively, shall be continuations of the state water resources board and the executive director of the state water resources board.
 - Sec. 4. There is hereby established within and as a part of the Kansas water resources authority a division of water resource administration and regulation, the head of which shall be the deputy director for water resource administration and regulation. Under the supervision of the director of water resources, the deputy director shall administer the division of water resource administration and regulation. The deputy director for water resource administration and regulation shall be appointed by the director of water resources and shall be in the classified service under the Kansas civil service act.
- Sec. 5. (a) On July 1, 1981, the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture created by K.S.A. 74-506a, and the office of the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture created by K.S.A. 74-506d, are hereby abolished.

the existing office of the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture are hereby transferred to and conferred and imposed upon, respectively, the Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order.

- (c) The Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources shall be the successors in every way, respectively, to the powers, duties and functions of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture and the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture in which the same were vested prior to the effective date of this order. Every act performed in the exercise of such powers, duties and functions by or under the authority of the Kansas water resources authority or director of water resources established by this order, respectively, shall be deemed to have the same force and effect as if performed by the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture or the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture in which such powers, duties and functions were vested prior to the effective date of this order.
- (d) Whenever the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the Kansas water resources authority established by this order.
- (e) Whenever the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the director of water resources established by this order.
- (f) All rules and regulations of the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture in existence on the effective date of this order shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be duly adopted rules and regulations of the director of water resources established by this order until revised, amended, revoked or nullified pursuant to law. The director of water resources may adopt rules and regula-

oiso tions governing the administration of the division of water reoiso source administration and regulation.

- (g) All orders and directives of the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture in existence on the effective date of this order shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be orders and directives of the director of water resources established by this order until revised, amended or nullified pursuant to law.
- (h) On the effective date of this order, the director of water resources shall succeed to whatever right, title or interest the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture has acquired in any real property in this state, and said director shall hold the same for and in the name of the state of Kansas. On and after the effective date of this order, whenever any statute, contract, deed or other document concerns the power or authority of the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture to acquire, hold or dispose of real property or any interest therein, the director of water resources shall succeed to such power and authority.
- (i) The Kansas water resources authority and director of water resources established by this order, respectively, shall be continuations of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture and the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the state board of agriculture.
- Sec. 6. (a) On July 1, 1981, all of the powers and duties of the department of health and environment and the secretary of health and environment relating to water quantity supply and planning functions are hereby transferred to and conferred and imposed upon, respectively, the Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order.
- (b) The Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources shall be the successor in every way, respectively, to the powers and duties of the department of health and environment and the secretary of health and environment relating to water quantity supply and planning functions in which the same were vested prior to the effective date of this order. Every act performed in the exercise of such powers, duties and functions by

or under the authority of the Kansas water resources authority or the director of water resources shall be deemed to have the same force and effect as if performed by the department of health and environment or the secretary of health and environment, respectively, in which such powers and duties were vested prior to the effective date of this order.

- (c) Whenever the department of health and environment, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document in relation to water quantity supply and planning functions, such reference shall be deemed to apply to the Kansas water resources authority established by this order.
- (d) Whenever the secretary of health and environment, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document in relation to water quantity supply and planning functions, such reference shall be deemed to apply to the director of water resources established by this order.
- (e) All rules and regulations of the department of health and environment relating to water quantity supply and planning functions in existence on the effective date of this order shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be duly adopted rules and regulations of the director of water resources established by this order until revised, amended, revoked or nullified pursuant to law. The director of water resources may adopt rules and regulations relating to water quantity supply and planning.
- (f) All orders and directives of the department of health and environment or the secretary of health and environment relating to water quantity supply and planning functions in existence on the effective date of this order shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be orders and directives of the Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order, respectively, until revised, amended or nullified pursuant to law.
- (g) On the effective date of this order, the director of water resources shall succeed to whatever right, title or interest the department of health and environment or the secretary of health and environment has acquired in any real property in this state relating to water supply and planning functions, and said director

shall hold the same for and in the name of the state of Kansas. On and after the effective date of this order, whenever any statute, contract, deed or other document concerns the power or authority of the department of health and environment or the secretary of health and environment to acquire, hold or dispose of real property or any interest therein relating to water quantity supply and planning functions, the director of water resources shall succeed to such power or authority.

- (h) The Kansas water resources authority and the director of water resources established by this order, respectively, shall be continuations of the water quantity supply and planning functions of the department of health and environment and of the secretary of health and environment.
- Sec. 7. (a) There is hereby established an advisory board on water resources which shall be advisory to and consult with the director of water resources. The advisory board on water resources shall consist of seven members who shall be appointed by the governor. In making such appointments, the governor shall appoint a resident of each congressional district of the state as a member, and shall also appoint two members from the state at large who shall not be residents of the same congressional district, and one of the members appointed from the state at large shall be an attorney admitted to practice law in the state of Kansas.
- (b) The members of the advisory board on water resources shall serve a term of four years and until their successors are appointed and qualified, except that the term of office of the members appointed to the first board shall be as follows: Two members shall be appointed for terms of one year, two members shall be appointed for terms of two years, one member shall be appointed for a term of three years and two members shall be appointed for terms of four years. The governor shall designate the term of office for each member appointed to the first board. Upon the expiration of said terms of office, successors shall be appointed in the same manner as the original appointments for terms of four years. Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the board shall be filled in the same manner as the original

appointment for the remainder of the unexpired term.

- (c) The advisory board on water resources shall elect annually a chairperson from its own membership. The board shall hold at least four regular meetings each year and such additional meetings as the chairperson deems desirable, at a place and time to be fixed by the chairperson within the state of Kansas. Special meetings shall be called by the chairperson upon request of the director of water resources. Four members of the board shall constitute a quorum to transact its business.
- (d) The advisory board on water resources shall consult with and advise the director of water resources on matters relating to the management, conservation and development of the state's water resources and such other matters as the director may request or as may be prescribed by law.
- (e) The members of the advisory board on water resources attending regular or special meetings thereof shall be paid amounts provided in subsection (e) of K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 8. (a) The director of water resources may organize the Kansas water resources authority in the manner deemed most efficient, so long as the same is not in conflict with law. Division heads shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as the director of water resources may prescribe and such duties and powers as are prescribed by law. Division heads shall act for, and exercise the powers of, the director of water resources to the extent authority to do so is delegated by the director to the division head. Personnel of each division shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as the head of the division may prescribe and such duties and powers as are prescribed by law. Personnel of each division shall act for and exercise the powers of their division head to the extent authority to do so is delegated by the division head.
- (b) The director of water resources shall appoint all subordinate officers and employees of the Kansas water resources authority. All subordinate officers and employees shall be within the classified service under the Kansas civil service act, except that any person appointed as an attorney shall be within the

0304 unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act.

Sec. 9. On July 1, 1981, officers and employees who, imme-0305 diately prior to said date, were engaged in the performance of 0306 powers, duties or functions which are transferred pursuant to the 0307 provisions of this order, and who, in the opinion of the director of 0308 water resources, are necessary to perform the powers, duties and 0309 functions of the Kansas water resources authority, shall be trans-0310 ferred to, and shall become officers and employees of said au-0311 thority. Any such officer or employee shall retain all retirement 0312 benefits and all rights of civil service which had accrued to or 0313 vested in such officer or employee prior to the effective date of 0314 this order. The service of each such officer or employee so 0315 transferred shall be deemed to have been continuous. All 0316 transfers and any abolishments of personnel in the classified 0317 0318 service under the Kansas civil service act shall be in accordance with civil service laws and any rules and regulations adopted 0319 thereunder. 0320

Sec. 10. (a) On and after the effective date of this order, when any conflict arises as to the disposition of any power, duty or function or the unexpended balance of any appropriation as a result of any transfer made by this order, or under the authority of this order, such conflict shall be resolved by the governor, and the decision of the governor shall be final.

(b) In all cases under the provisions of this order where part 0327 or all of the powers, duties and functions of any state agency are 0328 0329 divided between the Kansas water resources authority and any 0330 other state agency, the Kansas water resources authority shall succeed to all property and records which were used for or 0331 pertain to the performance of the powers, duties and functions 0332 transferred to the Kansas water resources authority. Any conflict 0333 0334 as to the proper disposition of property or records arising under this section, and resulting from the transfer, attachment or aboli-0335 0336 tion of any state agency, or all or part of the powers, duties and functions thereof, shall be determined by the governor, and the 0337 0338 decision of the governor shall be final.

Sec. 11. Except as otherwise provided in this order, the director of water resources shall have the legal custody of all

records, memoranda, writings, entries, prints, representations or combinations thereof of any act, transaction, occurrence or event of the Kansas water resources authority and any agency or offices abolished or transferred under this order.

Sec. 12. (a) On July 1, 1981, the balance of all funds appropriated and reappropriated to any of the state agencies or offices abolished by this order is hereby transferred to the Kansas water resources authority and shall be used only for the purposes for which the appropriation was originally made.

- (b) On July 1, 1981, liability for all accrued compensation or salaries of officers and employees who, immediately prior to said date, were engaged in the performance of powers, duties or functions of any state agency or office abolished or transferred by this order shall be assumed and paid by the Kansas water resources authority established by this order.
- Sec. 13. (a) No suit, action or other proceeding, judicial or 0356 administrative, lawfully commenced, by or against any state 0357 agency mentioned in this order, or by or against any officer of the 0358 state in such officer's official capacity or in relation to the 0359 discharge of such officer's official duties, shall abate by reason of 0360 the governmental reorganization effected under the provisions of 0361 this order. The court may allow any such suit, action or proceed-0362 ing to be maintained by or against the successor of any such state 0363 agency or any officer affected. 0364
- (b) No criminal action commenced or which could have been commenced by the state shall abate by the taking effect of this order.
- Sec. 14. All of the provisions of this order shall take effect and have the force of general law on July 1, 1981, unless disapproved by either house of the legislature as provided by subsection (c) of section 6 of article 1 of the constitution of Kansas, and unless so disapproved, this order is to be published as and with the acts of the legislature and the statutes of this state.
